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About the Courses

Our goal is to explore math and science as they apply to the real world. In our class, we work cooperatively with one another, often utilizing partners and small groups, to complete problem and project-based lessons. To complete these lessons, students will be asked to think critically and apply the information we place in their notebooks. As Titans, students are expected to be respectful and responsible (prepared for class) each day.

School-Year Focus

Students will be challenged to write and speak in complete sentences using correct grammar, punctuation, and spelling throughout the school year. Students will learn many levels of academic and content-specific language through focused vocabulary-building activities. Students will work cooperatively in partners and groups with 3+ students. Specific group responsibilities aligned with content standards will be required for all students to practice collaboration skills.
