About the Program

The Future Teachers of North Carolina (FTNC) program provides opportunities for high school students with strong academic, interpersonal, and leadership skills to enroll in college-level education courses in their respective high schools to explore teaching as a profession.

Benefits

- Enhance your student portfolio with field experiences and honors-level coursework
- Opportunity to earn up to six hours of college credit from participating UNC universities (UNC Wilmington, North Carolina A&T, and Western Carolina)
- Gain valuable knowledge regarding the teaching profession and the North Carolina teacher licensure process
- Receive prestige associated with being a FTNC student

Am I Eligible?

To be eligible to participate in FTNC, you must meet the following requirements:

- Be a senior or junior
- Have and maintain a 3.0 grade point average



Is FTNC Right for Me?

The FTNC program consists of two rigorous, college-level education courses that are taught by highly qualified teachers selected by the University of North Carolina System Office. The courses are unique in that they will challenge you, expose you to enriching field experiences, and prepare you to tackle college course work. Additionally, you will have the opportunity to receive three Career and Technical Education (CTE) credits; and earn up to six college credits if you chose to apply, be admitted, and enroll in one of the three partner institutions: the University of North Carolina Wilmington, North Carolina Agricultural & Technical State University, and Western Carolina University.

Apply Today!

To apply for the Future Teachers of North Carolina program you must do the following:

- Submit a FTNC student application
- Be recommended in writing by three teachers
- Submit an essay on why you wish to be a FTNC student
- Submit a transcript with 3.0 or higher grade point average
- Attend a FTNC informational session (*where applicable*)

Application and student requirements are established by the University of North Carolina System Office.
