HONORS PRE-CALCULUS COURSE GUIDELINES

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The **Honors Pre-Calculus** course provides students with an in-depth study of functions as well as trigonometry. Appropriate technology, from manipulatives to calculators and application software, may be used for instruction and assessment. This course will be more rigorous than previous mathematics courses, therefore your effort must be significantly greater as well.

Supplies

- A 3-ring binder with pocket dividers (1.5 inch-2 inch) to be used only for math.

- Calculator. A TI-84+ or TI-84+CE is *required* for this course.

Assignment Policy

Assignments are given to reinforce what has been learned in class, prepare for upcoming lessons, extend and generalize concepts, teach responsibility, and help students develop positive study habits.

- Assignments will be given <u>daily</u> and will be posted in <u>Canvas</u>. Full solutions will be posted in Canvas as well.
- Your success in this course is directly proportional to your dedication to homework assignments.
- Assignments must be worked on during class. If time does not permit the work to be completed, it should be taken home and finished.
- <u>Homework quizzes and random checks</u> will occur throughout the semester

Grading Policy

- Grades will be based on tests, quizzes, homework, and online tools (Desmos/Delta Math/etc)
- Tests will be given at the end of each unit and will be announced.
- Quizzes will be short, frequent and may be unannounced.
- Your nine-week's grade will be calculated by total points and may be averaged at any time by dividing a student's total number of points by the total number of points
- If a student is caught cheating, a penalty of <u>zero</u> will be given for that assignment, quiz, or test and reported to the honor committee for Beta, NHS, etc.

Attendance and Tardies

- It is to your benefit to be in class every day. Use good judgment in scheduling doctor appointments, and other activities so that they so do not interfere with your responsibility to attend class.
- If you have a planned absence, PLEASE let me know at least 2 days in advance.

Make-up Work

- This course moves at a very quick pace, therefore attendance is very important. When you are not in class, it is your responsibility to make-up any missed assignments. Copy any notes for the class you missed from a classmate.

- After <u>one week</u> any assignment, quiz, or test not made up will become a zero.
