#### **Financial Aid Packages**

If you have applied to several colleges and been offered a seat at more than one, you have a decision to make about which college you will attend. It's wonderful to have choices, but it may be hard to decide because there are so many factors to consider. One important factor is cost. Each college will soon send you a financial aid offer, but the offers can be confusing because each college communicates in their own manner. # Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

If you haven't yet applied for financial aid, it's not too late! Visit <a href="www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a> to complete the application. After you apply, watch your e-mail for a <a href="Student Aid Report">Student Aid Report</a> (SAR) containing important information. When you read about the scholarships at the end of this newsletter, you will see that many require FAFSA completion.

"One of the biggest myths about financial aid is that you can't (or shouldn't) submit the FAFSA if your parents have a high income. Everyone, regardless of their parents' income, should submit the FAFSA. The FAFSA unlocks more than federal grants and aid. Many states, aid programs and colleges require that you fill out the FAFSA

to be eligible for other forms of aid including work-study and loans. By not completing the FAFSA, students missed out an estimated \$2.7 billion in free FAFSA college aid in 2016, according to NerdWallet." ~CollegeBoard.org

Every male student has 30 days after he turns 18 years old to register with the selective service. Discipline: Merit. Award: \$5,000/semester to apply toward tuition OR room/board. Requirements: senior planning to enroll in a 4-year participating university. In NC, App State participates. Students do not have to be in ROTC in high school to apply for this scholarship. Apply and earn admittance at university and pass an Army physical. Students join ROTC in college as an elective. No commitment to service in your first year. After your first year, you are asked to commit to the Army active duty or reserve. - Photos:
  Each ad has a photo limit; supply up to that # of pictures. If you include extra pictures, our staff will decide which one(s) to exclude without notifying you.
- Photos that include alcohol, guns, or are taken on railroad tracks will not be accepted.
- We will enlarge or reduce your photos as necessary. We will also "crop" (focus on key parts of) the picture to its best advantage.

#### Text:

- We will choose a font (typeface) for your copy when we compose your ad. We will also correct grammar, punctuation and spelling errors. Therefore, if a word needs to be spelled a certain way, make sure we know it.
- · Take into account the size of your ad when writing your message to your child. A large quantity of text in any ad will end up being set in very small type which may not be easy to read.
