#### (CCM) Project Independence

Eligibility: must be working

16 homes in the area (most are 2 bedroom and four are 3 bedrooms); families will be expected to pay a portion of rent (well below market value), receive subsidies from Community Link; can be in program for up to 24 months- Goal it to help them to be independent and have their own place.

Eligibility: <u>Must be at least 18 years old</u>; 8 beds for individual women and 24 beds for individual men; 1 family room (4 bunk beds and a crib) can be used for a family that might be in transition, however, if there is a mother and father, the father would be required to sleep in the section of the shelter designated for men.

Serves dinner and breakfast; does laundry; curfew is at 10 pm; doors open at 7 p.m. and must bout by 7 a.m.

Some case management services

Soup kitchen – open to anyone Monday-Friday 11:30-12:30

CVAN – Support, shelter and safety for battered women and their children.

Services include 24 hour hotline, court advocacy, children's program, court advocacy, formerly battered women's advocacy, shelter.

\*If a student is temporarily in a shelter setting, McKinney-Vento eligible and attends a school where the homelessness first occurred (school of origin) a school social worker may be able to assist with keeping the student in the school of origin for the remainder of the school year. Contact a CCS school social worker for more information.
