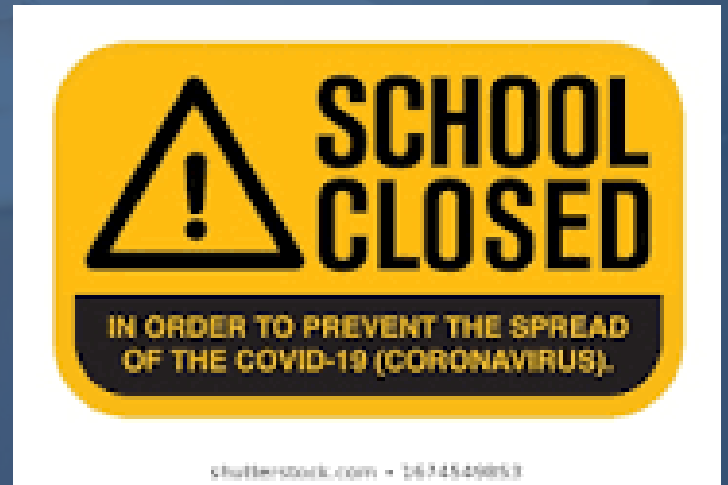
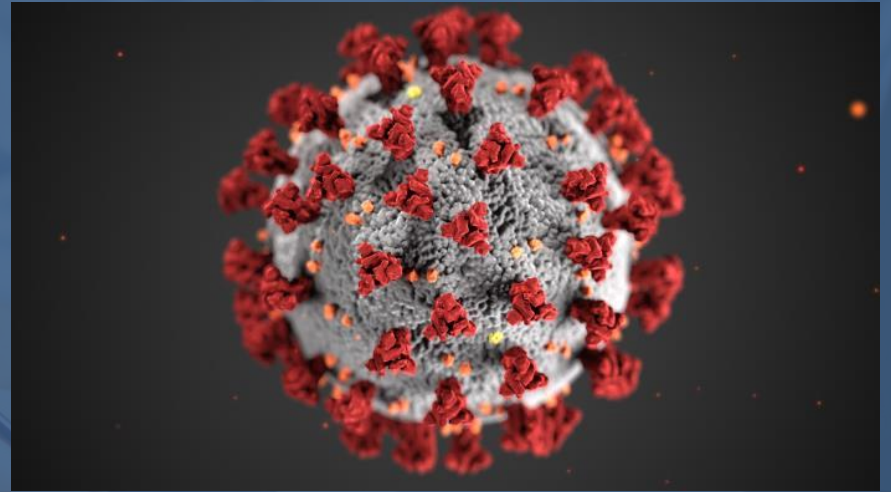

- Ranks in the top 20% of their school class.

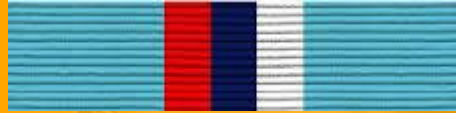

- Demonstrate adherence to military discipline.
- Possess leadership ability and a fundamental and patriotic understanding of the importance of JROTC training.

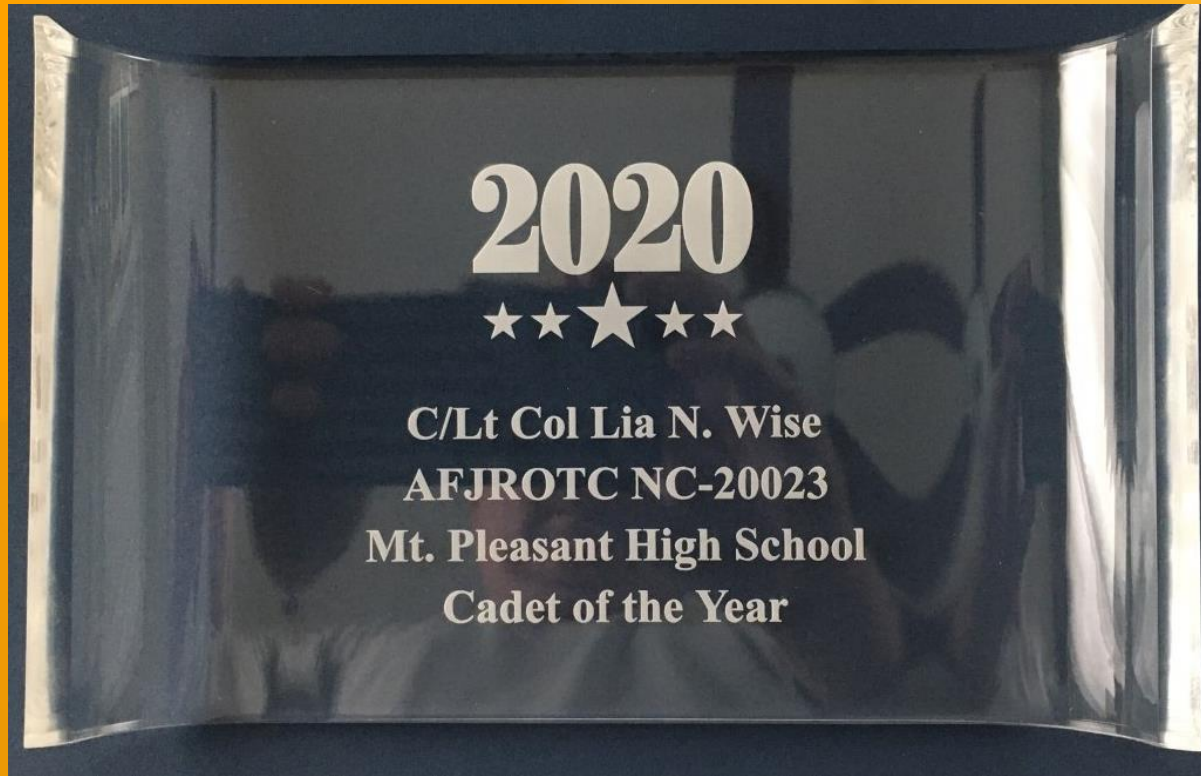


# Cadet of the Year Nominees
