### **Anti-Saloon** League

Founded in 1893, it was Ohio state organization that was for Prohibition. They worked with churches to assemble resources that would aid their cause.





Since many states relied on excise tax, a tax applied to alcohol, they lost a percentage of their revenue, and nationally they lost \$11 billion. Pharmacists and religious establishments were an exception to the law, so bootleggers ran pharmacies, and attendance rose at churches and synagogues.
