Early Decision and Early Action

If you find a college that you know is a right for you, consider applying by the early action deadline. Applying early gets you an answer earlier from the college, but before you commit to anything, be aware of what you are committing to. Early Decision is <u>binding</u> and prevents further exploration of other colleges. SAT/ACT

Most universities have made providing SAT/ACT test scores in your application optional, so they will not be required as part of the admissions process. If you would like to take or re-take the SAT for a higher score, there is an SAT on Saturday October 1, 2022. The deadline to register for it is September 20, 2022 at www.collegeboard.org There is an ACT on Saturday October 22, 2022. The deadline to register is September 16, 2022 at www.act.org . If you want to send your scores, visit www.collegeboard.org to order your SAT scores sent to universities. Visit www.act.org to order your ACT scores sent to universities. School Counselors cannot send your scores, because the ACT and SAT charge a fee to send scores.

Transcript Information

Colleges will require that you send your official transcript as part of your application. Usually, you will send it electronically. Here's how...

Electronic options:

- 1. Online at www.CFNC.org This is free because you send it yourself through the 'Transcript Manager' to ANY two or four year college in North Carolina.
- 2. Online at Parchment. Some colleges use this platform and will ask you to enter your School Counselor's e-mail address into your application. Your School Counselor receives a message from Parchment and uploads your official transcript directly to the site. You are notified through Parchment after your transcript has been sent. This counts as one of your free transcript requests.
- 3. Online at Common App / Naviance. Many colleges use this platform and will ask you to enter your School Counselor's e-mail address into your application. Your School Counselor receives a message from the Common App and uploads your official transcript directly to the site. You are notified through Common App that your transcript has been sent. This counts as one of your free transcript requests.

Paper option: Complete a transcript request form for each place you want to send one. The blank form is available on the senior canvas course and in the School Counseling Office. E-mail the completed transcript request form to Lisa.ryan@cabarrus.k12.nc.us or drop off your paper copy in the School Counseling Office. These cost \$5.00 each after you have requested 3 through Parchment, Common App or paper.

Please do not ask your School Counselor to e-mail your transcript to college coaches, admissions officers, scholarships etc. We are not allowed to e-mail your transcript because Cabarrus County Schools does not consider e-mail to be secure for your private information.

NC Residency Certification Number

To be billed the less expensive "In-State" rather than "Out-of-state Tuition" at your college, you will need your Residency Certification Number (RCN). Visit www.ncresidency.org and complete the process to receive your RCN. You will then provide this number to colleges as a part of the application process. This can be completed before, during, or after submitting the college application, but your School Counselor recommends completing it before you submit your application(s).

Letters of Recommendation

Many colleges and universities require letters of recommendation along with your application for admission. These letters are an important way for admissions officials to gain insight into your personal strengths, weaknesses, and accomplishments. When asking someone to write a letter of recommendation for you, consider the following tips:

• Ask for letters at least 2 weeks before the application deadline.

- Be sure to use a "letter of recommendation request form," which provides valuable information to the writer. Blank forms are available in your 12th grade canvas course.
- Be courteous and polite when requesting letters of recommendation. Remember that you are asking the person to do something extra on top of their usual workload.
- Only ask adults you know can write a strong letter for you. If someone doesn't know
 you well enough to advocate for your admission, you should ask someone who knows
 you better and can write a strong letter on your behalf.
- Provide all necessary information, forms, addresses, and envelopes to complete and submit the letter of recommendation. Make sure you follow the directions on how to send the letter to the college.

College/University Open Houses and tours

If you have not already visited colleges that you are interested in, it is not too late! Most colleges are offering in-person and virtual tours. You can sign up for a tour or open house by going to the college's website. This is the best way to know if the college is a good fit for you. Colleges track your visits to determine how likely you are to accept a seat should they offer you one. Here is a virtual open house for all 16 UNC System Public Universities. Financial Aid

To apply for any type of aid, you must complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). The FAFSA will go live on October 1, 2022. It is a good idea to complete the FAFSA as soon as you can as aid is distributed on a first come, first served basis. After you apply, you will receive a report explaining what your family is expected to contribute. Colleges use that

report to offer you a financial aid package and communicate with students about scholarships. Gather these materials before you start the application for a smooth process:

- ✓ Student FSA ID and parent FSA ID are created by visiting https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa/filling-out/fsaid
- ✓ Social Security numbers.
- ✓ Driver's license.
- ✓ Tax information from last year.

Military recruiters will also be available to speak with interested families. Employers will also be available to meet with students who wish to enter the work force right after high school.

Residency | FAFSA | Applications

Countdown to College (C2C) supports college access every October. C2C activities help high school seniors complete three important college enrollment steps: residency, FAFSA, and applications. Many NC colleges and universities will support C2C by waiving application fees during College Application Week, October 17-21, 2022.

The list of participating colleges will be available in early October and will be posted in the October 'Senior Notes' newsletter coming to your e-mail account in early October. Watch for it!

Demonstration of Interest (DOI)

Colleges try to determine which students are really interested in them. They use this information to decide who to admit in the hopes that those who showed a lot of interest will accept the offer. There are many ways to demonstrate your interest in a college.

- 1. Attend the 'Future Fair' at the Cabarrus Arena on October 17th. (see the Future Fair section earlier in this newsletter)
- 2. Open the colleges' e-mails to you. Colleges have technology that tells them if you open their messages and how many times you check their websites.
- 3. If a college rep. is visiting your high school, go to their presentation/meet with them.
- 4. Visit the college campus virtually or in-person.
- 5. Apply during the 'early action' window.
- 6. In your essays and anytime you meet a representative from the college, explain why you are interested in this college/program.
- 7. After you are offered a seat at the college, answer their messages promptly and apply for the scholarships they recommend.

Photos

- · We will enlarge or reduce your photos as necessary. We will also "crop" (focus on key parts of) the picture to its best advantage.

Text:

- We will choose a font (typeface) for your copy when we compose your ad. We will also correct grammar, punctuation and spelling errors. Therefore, if a word needs to be spelled a certain way, make sure we know it.
- Take into account the size of your ad when writing your message to your child. A large quantity of text in any ad will end up being set in very small type which may not be easy to read.
