2. Content

- The overarching theme of English III is <u>Catalysts For Change</u>. We will be exploring this theme through four units.
- Our four units are
 - Unit 1: The Origins of Change
 - Anchor Text: The Masque of the Red Death + More by Edgar Allen Poe
 - o Unit 2: Belonging, Beliefs, & Moral Dilemmas
 - Anchor Text: The Great Gatsby by F. Scott Fitzgerald
 - Unit 3: The Journey to Equality
 - Anchor Text: Twelfth Night by William Shakespeare
 - Unit 4: The Effect of Power and Control on the World
 - Anchor Text: Literature Circles
- Each unit will last approximately four to five weeks. We will read one major literary work
 each unit and take several assessments throughout each unit to determine and assess
 mastery of the standards.

3. Grading

- Our course will be graded by Category Weights. Your grade will be based on the following categories
 - o Tests (four per semester) 40%
 - Projects/Writing (four per semester) 40%
 - Classwork/Homework (1-2 per week) 20%
- All assignments are due on their due date. When a student is absent from class or
 experiencing extenuating circumstances, all missing work must be turned in by the unit
 assessment to receive a grade. Students are responsible for self-advocating when
 experiencing circumstances that prevent them from turning in work by the due date.
- Retesting Policy

- Final Exam Details
 - This course is a semester class and the exam will be taken at the end of the first semester. The exam is a teacher-made test.

6. Miscellaneous

• Drivers license statement - The Dropout Prevention/Driver's License legislation from the State of North Carolina requires that the CHS is to notify the Department of Motor Vehicles when a student is not making adequate academic progress or drops out of school. "Adequate academic progress" is defined as having passing grades in 70% or more of a student's classes during each semester. A student on the 4 X 4 block (Cabarrus County High Schools) will have his/her license or permit revoked if the student does not pass at least three (3) courses during a semester. Students who dropout of school and are not making adequate academic progress will also have his/her license or permit revoked. A new Driving Eligibility Certificate cannot be granted for a period of six-months even if the student enrolls in a non-public school or community college.
