Teen Collisions

 Leading cause of death for people age 16 and 17

- Young drivers are twice as likely as adult drivers to be in a fatal crash
- Immaturity and inexperience contribute to deadly crashes by young drivers
- Three stage GDL laws address these factors

What is Risk?

The chance of injury or loss of life







Characteristics of Risk

- Always present
- Perceived differs from actual
- Is shared
- Can be changed/analyzed/altered



Risk Perception

 Evaluation of risk present at the time the maneuver is made





Risk Management

 Altering risk by making adjustments to position and/or speed
