



Marching soldiers




#### **Trench Warfare**






# **Treaty of Versailles**



- June 28, 1919
- Create 9 new nations
- Est. mandates in the Middle East
- German War Guilt Clause \$33 billion in reparations
- Resentment sows the seeds of World War II
- US Senate rejects the treaty and signs a separate treaty with Germany in 1921


