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## Setting/ Main Idea/ Problem

- \* What is \_\_\_\_\_'s problem? How is the problem solved? Use evidence from the story to support your answer.
- \* Tell the story in your own words. Write about the beginning, middle, and end of the story.
- \* What is the problem in this story and how is it solved? Use details from the story to help explain your answer.
- \* Tell what happens in the story. Be sure to use details.
- \* Explain how \_\_\_\_\_. Use information from the book to support your answer.

## Inference and Details

- \* Why do \_\_\_\_\_ at the end of the story? Use part of the story in your answer.
- \* Tell why \_\_\_\_\_ is a good title for this story. Use details from the book to support your answer. .
- \* How does the picture on page \_\_\_\_\_ help you understand the story?
- \* Fables teach us lessons. What lesson does this fable teach?
- \* What lesson did \_\_\_\_\_ learn in the story? How do you know?

## Responding to Text

**Restate the question as a statement:** Use part of the question in your answer.

**Answer the question:** Be sure you understand the question and answer all parts of it.

**Use evidence from the story:** Be sure to look back in the story and use quotes, page numbers, or other evidence to show where you got the answer.

**Add details that support your answer.** Adding details to your answer ensures that you answered the question completely and shows that you understand the text.
