North Carolina Assessment Specifications

Purpose of the Assessments

North Carolina Final Exams (NCFEs) for Social Studies measure students' academic progress in the <u>NC *Essential Standards*</u>, adopted by the North Carolina State Board of Education (SBE) in <u>December 2010</u>.

□NC State Board of Education policy <u>TEST-016</u> directs schools to use the results from all course-specific NCFEs as a minimum of 20% of the student's final course grade.

□NCFEs are not used for school and district accountability under the READY Accountability Model or for federal reporting purposes.

Developing Assessments

□North Carolina educators are recruited and trained to write new items for the NCFEs. The diversity among the item writers and their knowledge of the content standards are addressed during recruitment. Trained North Carolina educators also review items and suggest improvements, if necessary. The use of North Carolina educators to develop and review items strengthens the instructional validity of the items. Curriculum and Assessment Cycle

- 2010: North Carolina SBE adoption of the <u>NC Essential Standards</u>
- 2012–13: Operational administration of the Measures of Student Learning: Common Exams
- 2013–14: Redesign and subsequent first operational administration of the NCFEs
- 2014–15: Second operational administration of the NCFEs
- 2015–16: Third operational administration of the NCFEs
- 2016–17: Fourth operational administration of the NCFEs
- 2017–18: Fifth operational administration of the NCFEs

Prioritization of Standards

Members of the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction's (NCDPI) Test Development Section invited teachers to collaborate and develop recommendations for a prioritization of the standards, indicating the relative importance of each standard, the anticipated instructional time, and the appropriateness of the standard for multiple-choice and constructed response item formats.

Tables 1–4 describe the range of total items that will appear on the NCFE forms. All the following NCFEs contain only multiple-choice items. The multiple-choice items are worth one point each. In order to ensure that the four dimensions of historical thinking remain central to the history tests, item developers incorporated Standard 1 across as many items as possible.

Cognitive Rigor

The items on the Social Studies NCFEs were aligned to the <u>NC *Essential Standards*</u> using the Revised Bloom's Taxonomy (RBT).

Types of Items and Supplemental Materials

The NCFEs for High School Social Studies courses consist of four-response-option multiplechoice items.

Many of the items require students to process factual content as they read, interpret, and/or analyze stimulus material, including maps, graphs, and excerpts of primary and secondary-source documents.

The answer sheet (i.e., multiple-choice only) may be reviewed at the <u>NCDPI/Accountability</u> <u>Services</u> website.

A complete list of the supplemental test materials (i.e., 2017–2018 NC Final Exams Materials *List*) may be reviewed at the <u>NCDPI/Accountability Services</u> website.

Released items are available on the <u>NCDPI/Accountability Services</u> Website. Released items may be used by school systems to help acquaint students with items. The released items, however, may not reflect the breadth of the standards assessed and/or the range of item difficulty found on the NCFE. These materials must not be used for personal or financial gain. The released items are also available to schools through NCTest, the NCDPI's online assessment platform.

Schools must ensure every student participating in an online assessment for the North Carolina Testing Program has completed the appropriate Online Assessment Tutorial for the associated assessment(s) at least one time per year at the school before test day. The tutorial provides students the opportunity to practice the mechanics of navigating through the testing platform, to become familiar with the tools, and to respond to the sample items. Refer to the <u>Online Test</u> <u>Administrator's Guide</u> for additional information.

Testing Structure and Test Administration Time

The NCFEs of World History, American History I, American History II, American History: The Founding Principles, Civics, and Economics contain 42 multiple-choice items.

Included in the total item counts are embedded multiple-choice field test items that will not count toward or against a student's score. These items are examined for inclusion on future operational assessments.

*Field test items will not count toward or against a student's score.

Students will be given 120 minutes to answer all items.

Appendices A–D show the number of operational items for each clarifying objective for the 2017–18 exams. Note that future coverage of objectives could vary within the constraints of the test specifications' weights in Tables 1–4.

Test Cycle and Delivery Mode

The NCFEs are administered to students enrolled in fall, spring, and yearlong courses. A list of course codes that align with the 2017–18 NCFEs (i.e., *Course Codes that Align with the NC Final Exams*) is available on the NCDPI/Accountability Services website.

The NCFEs are administered through NCTest, the NCDPI's online assessment platform. Paper editions are also available.

The NC Final Exams are only provided in English; translated versions are not available.
