

POLICIES– DROPPING CLASSES

- Students are not allowed to drop a class after the first day of classes
- Dropping a class is only allowed for administrative reasons & with permission
- If a student drops a class or is dropped from a class by the college:
 - Receive an “F” for a high school grade and will have to pay for the book for that class.
 - If the class is taken out of sequence, must wait for sequenced time to retake class
- Failed classes can result in loss of Driver’s License.



POLICIES– GRADE REPLACEMENT

- Can only attempt to replace the grade in classes currently passed with a "C" better 4 times during high school.
- The grade earned in the 2nd attempt will be the grade on the transcript, even if it is lower.


WHAT TO EXPECT

- **Not Feeling Connected to the School**


WHAT CAN YOU DO
