Dear Band Parents:

Welcome to the William Lenoir Middle School Band Family! I am delighted that your son or daughter will be participating in our sixth grade band for this school year. I am very excited about becoming your child's band director and have been looking forward to this experience all summer long.

Band is both a group and an individual activity. Each student must be able to play his or her part alone, and also with the entire band. One unprepared student can harm the group's performance. Proper balance and sound cannot be achieved without each member doing his or her best at all times. For these reasons, I expect each student to <u>practice as much as possible at home every day</u>. You have made an expensive investment in the purchase of an instrument and your son's or daughter's success depends greatly on this practice time. I need your support and assistance in this matter.

Your son or daughter will need several items for their band class. Every student will need a good quality instrument, a band methods book (Essential Elements for band Book 1), pencils, reeds for woodwind instruments (VanDoren Size 2-1/2), value oil for brass instruments, drum sticks for percussion, and a stand (for at home practicing). Students will need these supplies at the beginning of school, and should bring all of these items (except the stand) to class everyday.

Although these students will not be performing in public this semester, I hope you will take advantage of the opportunity to attend the Christmas Concert given by our seventh and eighth grade bands and Chorus as the sixth grade band students will have the opportunity to earn extra credit by attending this concert. The Sixth Grade Band will be performing in two concerts next semester in 2024. For your convenience, a schedule is attached and I urge to keep for future reference as to the dates and times. These concerts are required activities and unexcused absences will result in a loss of band awards and could result in dismissal from band.

Student grades will be based on playing and written tests and daily playing in class. I am available most mornings after 7:45 and afternoons until 4:00 for play-offs and extra help. Discipline will be handled on an individual basis following the attached plan. A daily participation grade will also be determined through the student having his/her band instrument, music, and pencil in class each day.

WILLIAM LENOIR MIDDLE SCHOOL BAND RULES AND CONSEQUENCES

- 1. **Practice Every Day**, Take instrument home and practice every night, and attend class with all required materials
- 2. Be Prepared Everyday. Participation Grades will be determined as follows:
 - 1. All students will start with a grade of 100
 - 2. Each time the instrument is left at home 5 points will be deducted
 - 3. Each time the instrument is left at school 5 points will be deducted. Parents will be notified when the student has left their instrument more than 3 times.
 - 4. Each time the music and/or band book is not with student 3 points will be deducted
 - 5. Each time a pencil is not with the student 3 points will be deducted
 - 6. The total number of points left at the end of the grading period will be counted as the student's participation grade. It is my expectation that 98% of the students will have the full 100 points left to help raise their band average.
- 3. **Be On Time!!!**
- 4. <u>Don't Disturb Class by talking or playing out of turn!</u>
- 5. Respect Yourself and Others
- 6. **NO GUM IN CLASS**
- 7. NO CELL PHONES, AIR PODS, or SMART WATCHES in class

Behavioral Procedure

- 1. 1st Warning of the 9 Weeks Verbal Warning
- 2. 2nd Warning of the 9 Weeks Parent Contact
- 3. 3rd Warning of the 9 Weeks Demerit Given
- 4. 4th Warning of the 9 Weeks Office Referral

Please note that chewing gum, candy, or any other foreign substance in the band room during class will result in a behavioral consequence each time.

* If I am ever out of school, any name that I receive from the substitute teacher will be sent to ISS the next day!!!

Grading Policy

Tests 30% - an average of written and playing tests that are given as well as the student's participation grade and grades given for forms to be turned into the teacher.

Rehearsal 40% - an average of weekly grades based on well the student is musically prepared and performs in class.

Concerts 30% - grade based on participation in all band performances.

ALL STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO ATTEND ALL PERFORMANCES

Band Assignments and Playing Tests

Assignments such as worksheets, playing tests and written tests will be given in class. Your child will be on a weekly worksheet or testing schedule. There will either be a test (playing or written) or a worksheet activity at least every two weeks.

School Owned Instruments

If your child is playing a school owned instrument, they will bring a contract home to be signed by the parent or guardian before the instrument is given to them. I will be sending the contract this week.
