The Caldwell County School System is a nationally accredited public school district enrolling nearly 11,000 students in grades PreK-13. The community is part of the Unifour area of North Carolina which has a population of over 400,000. The district includes 6 high schools: 3 traditional high schools, an alternative school, and 2 innovative high schools located on



the community college campus. There are 12 elementary schools for students in grades K-5, 4 middle schools serving grades 6-8, and 3 K-8 schools positioned in the scenic, rural areas of Caldwell County.

South Caldwell High School is located on a 100 acre campus in southern Caldwell County and serves approximately 1,300 students in grades 9-12. The student - to - teacher ratio is 16:1. Students come from a rural community of families who work mainly in the manufacturing and service industries. South Caldwell High School utilizes 4x4 Block Scheduling, and each student attends 4 classes daily for an entire semester. Credits are awarded after the end of each semester grading period.

As a result of COVID-19 beginning March 13, 2020, all students in Caldwell County finished the 2019-2020 year virtually. Students had the option to choose a virtual option, Caldwell Connect, or a hybrid model for the 2020-2021 school year. Approximately, 28% of South Caldwell students were fully virtual for the 2020-2021 school year. Students choosing a hybrid model attended school two days a week and received virtual learning three days a week until April when students began attending four days a week. For the 2021-2022 school year, students had the option to choose full in person instruction five days or Caldwell Online a fully virtual option. Approximately 9% of students chose Caldwell Online for the 2021-2022 school year. In 2022-2023, 50 students chose to remain 100% virtual, which equals 4% of the student population at SCHS. In 2023-2024, Caldwell Online Academy became its own high school. So any student that chooses to learn virtually had to apply, be accepted, and graduate from COA. Therefore, South Caldwell High School students are a traditional high school with a promising future. We, the Spartans, look forward to achieving that promise together.
