Grading Scale and Grading Weights:

Grading Scale:		Classwork and weekly homework count evenly in the gradebook. Quizzes will be given weekly. Each quiz grade will count 1.25x in the gradebook.

<59	F	At the end of each quarter, a grade will be given on class participation and overall completion of all work, graded and ungraded. This will reflect their overall performance for each quarter and will be counted as a test grade. Occasional extra credit opportunities will be considered and graded at my own discretion.
		Most online assignments can be completed multiple times to improve a student's score up to a 100%. Paper assignments can be corrected for a higher grade, up to an 85%.

Lesson Plans and Missing Work:

The vast majority of all classroom resources will be posted in Canvas. **Grades will be posted in PowerSchool only.** For example, a copy of a paper assignment will be uploaded for students to access digitally in case of an absence or missing work, but the grades will only be posted in PowerSchool. The majority of my math grades will be work completed on paper. This allows students to find all their assignments in one place. My lesson plans, contact information, announcements, and important links will be located here as well. All grades will be updated at least once a week.

In a math class, it is important that students stay on top of their work. Math is sequential, and I need to know how students are understanding the material so I can pace their learning appropriately. In an effort to help all students be better prepared for high school, my late work policy is as follows:

- Students who are absent will have the same number of days to complete work as they are absent without penalty per county policy.
- All students will be given a 24 hour grace period to turn in any assignments they may not have completed during the class period.
- Penalties for late work will accrue as follows:
 - More than one day late = 5 point penalty
 - Two to seven days late = 10 point penalty
 - Greater than one week late = 15 point penalty
 - Greater than two weeks late = 20 point penalty

Late work from the first half of the grading period will not be accepted after progress reports are sent home!

If a student does not turn in an assignment, you may receive a note home in his/her planner, an email, or a phone call. This will also be noted in PowerSchool. However, if late assignments become a habit, I will ask to schedule a parent/teacher/student conference to remedy the situation before it gets out of hand. If even after interventions, the student is still struggling to turn in work or meet grade level expectations, we will meet to set up an Academic Success contract.

Student Contracts:

Based on last year's test scores, grades, attendance and behavior, students who were not proficient in 7th grade may be placed on academic/behavioral/attendance contracts this year. This is a contract between the student, the parents, the teachers and administrators, stating what each of us will do to help your child grow and close the gap. Students also may be placed on a contract if performance during the year shows a lack of growth. If your child will be on a contract, we will meet with you to review the contract and discuss options to help your child. Student's placed on contracts may receive interventions during House time. We are also available from 10:15 to 11:00. **Students who fail to uphold their academic contracts will be considered for retention.**

Students are always welcome to come to my classroom early in the morning for extra assistance on topics or assignments. I may also offer after school tutoring on Monday afternoons depending on the need and my availability.
