2023-2024 Parent and Family Engagement Policy

Lower Creek Elementary School recognizes the critical role of parents in the education of their children. We will promote and support parent involvement and family engagement in student learning and achievement at school and at home and encourage successful progress toward graduation. Promotion of responsible parenting

Informational flyers, community resources, and positive phone calls contribute to the promotion of positive parenting. Additional resources are available from Student Support Staff.

Community collaboration

LCES has designated school and faith-based business partners and additional local businesses that provide services or resources when needed. Our PTA often works with local businesses to help support PTA events and to gain volunteers. Local service organizations provide individual student, grade level, and school wide supports, and volunteer work throughout the school year. These organizations include Lenoir Kiwanis, Lenoir Rotary, and the Altrusa Club.

Promotion of student health awareness

LCES is fortunate to have access to a school nurse that works with students, teachers, PTA, outside agencies, and parents for the benefit and welfare of our students. Along with appropriate staff, she facilitates medical contacts and/or appointments. Information is provided to families of school, district, and community health events. We promote healthy living (diet, exercise, rest) and encourage our parents to do the same...moving bodies make sharper minds!
