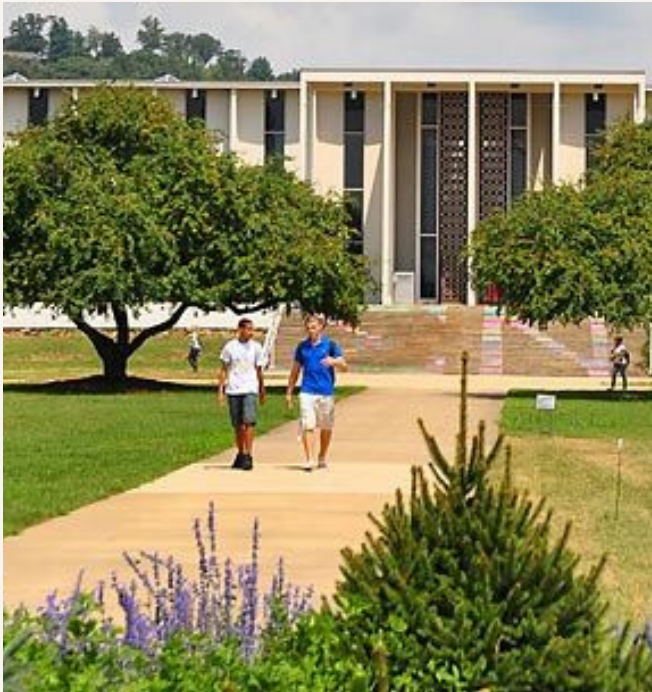
Where will you go after high school?

It's never too early to prepare for your post-high school life. Throughout this guidebook we'll go over the 4 main pathways (workforce, military, 2-year and 4-year college) you can take after you graduate high school, as well as how they can intertwine.

We will also look at the steps you need to take to achieve your goals, while giving you contacts and connections to do some research on your own.

COLLEGE BOUND

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You can think of the college application process in three steps: RDS, application(s), FAFSA.

Going to and graduating from college is a big accomplishment-- whether that be a 2 or 4-year school. If you want to attend college right after high school, there are several steps you must take in order to get there.



It's a good idea to explore majors and career pathways before your senior year. This way, you already know the requirements and standards needed to attend the college you want.

For example, to attend a UNC system school in North Carolina, you must have completed or be on track to complete all of the high school graduation requirements set by the state. Additionally, you must have taken 2 levels of a foreign language and a fourth math. In order to apply to a UNC system school, you must also have at least a 2.5 weighted GPA or a 19 ACT score or a 1010 SAT score. Two-year school admission requirements are a little different.

While most 2-year schools in North Carolina do not require you to have a fourth math or a foreign language, you should make sure the program you want to join does not have any special requirements.

For example, a radiology program at a community college or the 2-year Ag. Institute at NC State may require you to complete an additional level of math in order to be considered for admissions. You still must complete all of the North Carolina high school graduation requirements in order to attend. Additionally, there are 4-year private schools in our state that also may not have the same requirements as the UNC system. Again, you should research before you apply to make sure you still meet their admissions requirements.

When applying to a 2-year or 4-year school in North Carolina, in order to receive in-state tuition, you must complete the Residency Determination Service (RDS). RDS uses your and your parents'/guardians' personal information, like address, driver's license number and social security number, to conclude you live in the state. Without completing RDS, you will be required to pay out-of-state tuition, which can be thousands upon thousands of dollars more. You will complete RDS using your College Foundation of North Carolina (CFNC) account information. You should complete RDS early in your senior year of high school.

Following RDS, you still have to apply to college. Most applications for 2-year schools in North Carolina can be found on CFNC. If you cannot find your desired school's application on CFNC, you should visit the school's

admissions website. For most 4-year schools in North Carolina, you will find their application in 1 of 3 places: CFNC, Common App or the school's website.

If you want to apply to multiple schools using the Common App, you should start working in Common App first. However, if the schools you are wanting to apply to participate in Free College Application Week, then you should use CFNC. Still, some schools may prefer to use their own application via their website.

For most 4-year schools you will need to provide test scores, essays and letters of recommendations. It's important to view your applications early so you can gather the necessary information and materials. For recommendations, you should ask for your recommender's permission at least one month in advance of the due date.

Finally, to complete the college application process, you should submit the FAFSA. The FAFSA is your gateway for free money for college. *The FAFSA opens every year on October 1 for the next school year.* You will use your parent/guardian's tax information from 2 years prior to the school year for which you are applying to complete the FAFSA. For example, if you are filling out the FAFSA for the 2021-2022 school year, then you will use your 2019 taxes.

The earlier you complete the FAFSA, the more aid you are eligible for. You should check with your desired school to see when their FAFSA deadline is. Some schools will not give out institutional aid or scholarships without having a FAFSA on file.

- What makes this school special?
- How many undergraduate students attend this school?
- How diverse is this campus?
- What is the average class size?
- What major(s) does this school offer?
- When do I have to declare a major?
- Is it possible to double major?
- What opportunities do I have to study abroad?
- What type of academic support does this school offer?
- Does this school have an orientation program for incoming first-years or transfer students?
- What career services does this school offer?
- What kind of housing choices are there?
- Am I required to live on campus my first year?
- What meal plans are available?
- Can I have a car on campus?
- When is the FAFSA due each year?
- Does this school provide work-study?
- What scholarships/grants can I apply for? OR Where can I find scholarships/grants I can apply to?

Questions to ask current students or recent graduates:

- Why did you decide to attend this school?
- What do you like most about this school?
- If you could start your college journey over again, what would you change?
- What challenges did you face at this school?
- What has helped you succeed at this school?



IS THE MILITARY RIGHT FOR YOU?

Kick off your career with the US Military

After high school, you may decide to jump start your career by joining the military. With several branches and many jobs to choose from, the possibilities with the military are endless. In order to join the military, you need to take these necessary steps.

First, you'll need to contact and meet with recruiters. You don't have to choose one particular branch to start. You can meet with a recruiter from every branch to see which branch best fits you. Some jobs you are eligible for in the military are based on the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB). You should study for and take the ASVAB while meeting with recruiters. Then you'll need to complete the Military Entrance Processing Stations (MEPS). From there you'll need to continue physically training or follow a training path set out by your recruiter. By this time you will most likely have narrowed down which branch you will join; you'll begin discussing contracts and jobs with your recruiter. This is a good time to discuss signing bonuses and education opportunities.

Once you have a contract set, you will take your oath of enlistment. The next step will be to go to basic training then complete your contract. After your contract has been completed (usually 4-6 years), then you could finish your career with the military, go to college or join the workforce.

DO YOU WANT A FREE EDUCATION?

By joining a Reserves program you could go to college for free

Members of the Selected Reserves may be eligible for tuition assistance depending on the branch they are a part of. As a high school student wanting to go to college, but not sure how you're going to pay for it, looking in to the Reserves program may be worth your while. You'll still need to look in to the different branches and make sure what they offer aligns with your education and career goals. You'll want to be meeting with a recruiter during these discussions. Meeting with a recruiter does not commit you to joining the Reserves. If deciding the Reserves is right for you, then you'll still be required to go to basic training, and you'll be committing to work one weekend a month and train 2 weeks out of the year to complete your Reserve duties. Although, when you're not completing your Reserve duties, you're a regular college student.

JOINING THE WORKFORCE



Some students decide to join the workforce right out of high school. If you're considering joining the workforce right out of high school you should research careers, training, pay and benefits before committing to that job. You should also be networking with potential employers to make sure there are positions available when you graduate high school.

Throughout your senior year, you should meet with your Career Development Coordinator and network with potential employers to make sure you understand what it takes to do this job right out of high school. You don't want to be caught at graduation without any offers, so don't wait until it's too late.

QUESTIONS TO ASK

When entering the workforce, employers often use interviews to get to know applicants better. Interviews are also an opportunity for you to learn more about a job position.

These are some questions you may want to ask:

- Can you tell me about the type of supervision provided for this position?
- What type of training or orientation do new employees receive?
- Are there opportunities for advancement in the workplace?
- What have past employees done to succeed in this position?
- When should I expect to hear back from you?

If pay and/or benefits are not listed with the job posting:

- What is the pay for this position?
- Are there benefits available to someone in this position?
