- Pay annual dues: \$10 (after first year)

Members must also maintain the initial GPA requirements and continue to demonstrate excellent character and integrity. Please note that members may be removed by the faculty advisory council for noncompliance, and service hours are subject to change due to Covid-19 and faculty discretion.

Applications are due by October 13, 2023. The requirements are attached to this letter. Each application will be evaluated by the Spartan Lyceum Chapter selection committee members, which consist of South Caldwell faculty. If accepted, members will be notified promptly and asked to pay an induction fee of \$20. This fee will be used to cover yearly dues, membership induction fees, and induction ceremony refreshments. Students will then be invited to officially join the Spartan Lyceum Chapter during our induction ceremony on November 7th. Additional details will be provided.
