


- After Louisiana Purchase (1803)

 - Free Land




African Slavery

- Stagville was the largest plantation in NC









Trail of Tears

• Immigration Station for immigrants moving from Europe to the US








Angel Island

Port of San Francisco Pass Mrs. Fuku Terasawa


Cotton Gin

- Invention increased slavery










Canals and Railroads

- Better transportation = more goods = more \$\$\$







Wright Brothers Airplane

- Changed transportation = changed business and life








Research Triangle Park

 - NC residents = very low income, need better jobs
- The area's strength = a lot of educated college students
- The Government and Universities built RTP to attract businesses
 - Clear the land
 - Build roads
 - Fix NC image



Dismal Swamp Canal


- Oldest Canal in the US opened in 1805

 - Sent protest letter to King








Henry Berry Lowery
