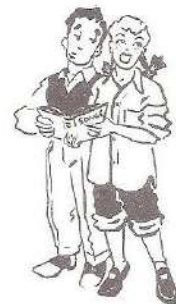


## BAND

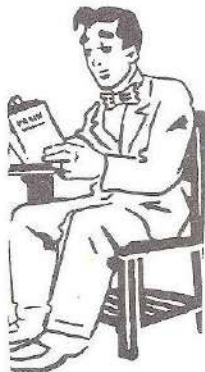
