Title One Family Resource Center

The Neil Armstrong Family Center is open all day on **Tuesdays and Thursdays from 7:00 a.m. to 3:25 p.m.** For our Spanish-speaking families, we provide Spanish services.

The Title 1 Family Reading Experience is an integral part of the school wide effort to offer educational support to our families. The atmosphere of the center is friendly, fun-filled, comfortable, and informative. Families are encouraged to come to the Center and talk with a professional about their child's reading. A Family Experience Worker is available to answer questions and direct families to agencies in the community that can assist with any current needs. We also have special community guests visit throughout the year.

Parents locate books that are "just right" for their child's current reading level. Having books on the correct level provides the greatest opportunity for reading skills to grow.

In addition to the weekly check-out books, each child receives a "keeper" book for their home library and a pencil each week.

Parent/Teacher Conferences

Conferences are one important way parents and teachers work together as a team. Parents sharing information about their child with the teacher is an important piece of this partnership. Conferencing gives the parent an update about academic progress, as well as gainful insight about how to help their child at home. Conferences are held either before school, after school, or during the teacher's planning time during the school day. A translator is available upon request.

Student-Led Conferences

We also are proud to offer Student-Led Conferences where are students present their current goals and data to their parents. These important conferences help our students evaluate their own progress, have a greater commitment to their school work and learning, build self-confidence, encourage better communication between student and parent, build more effective communication and critical thinking skills, and help each student become more actively involved in their learning.
