
Our first Kingsway Spirit Night of the year will be on Tuesday, September 26<sup>th</sup>, at Tropical Smoothie.



# KINDERGARTEN

Dear Kindergarten families,

Our kindergarten classes are off to a great start this school year! We have been working hard on learning routines, procedures, and rules within our school. We are practicing walking in line, going through the lunch line, and raising our hands.

In ELA, we have been focusing on the foundations and routines. We have been going over the alphabet and reading new stories. When reading new stories we are practicing becoming strong leaders. We are introducing writing, and the different strokes needed. We look forward to honing in on letters and their sounds along with rhyming words and syllables.

In math, we have been focusing on numbers 0-5. We are counting objects and relating that to the real world. We have used different types of manipulatives to show numbers 0-5. We have introduced terms such as equal to, greater than, and less than. We look forward to increasing to 10 along with comparing and sorting. In science, we have been learning about our five senses and how to use them. In social studies, we have been discussing where things are located in comparison to our location (above, below, left, right).

We have also been learning how to log on to our Chromebooks and how to take care of them. We have introduced our online learning apps: Lalilo, Redbird, and My Math Academy.

Things you can do at home with your child to help them be successful here at school: read to them daily, practice letters and letter sounds, practice writing their name using a pencil, and count objects around you.



In 4th grade, ELA students will be beginning Unit 1 in Benchmark. Our essential question for the unit is "How do we respond to nature?" In this unit, we will be focusing on many different skills such as: asking questions before, after, and during reading, writing expository essays, reviewing different ways to make the long a, o, and e sounds, and others. We will also be using our Studies Weekly newspapers to learn more about the wonderful state of Florida while also practicing our reading and writing skills.

In math, we have finished our "Math is" unit and found math in the world around us! We have also finished our Place Value unit and students did a wonderful job with naming, comparing, and rounding numbers. We are now starting our Multiplication and Division Facts Unit. This should be a refresher unit from third grade! Be sure to help your students practice their multiplication and division facts at home!

### FIFTH GRADE

# Welcorne Back



We have been busy reviewing rules and routines in fifth grade. Routines are things we do regularly. The classroom is full of routines. For instance, how we line up for lunch and recess, how we actively listen during instruction, and even where we sit in the room. If there were no rules and routines in place and everyone did what they thought was correct, the classroom could quickly become disorganized. Classroom routines help us feel comfortable with the daily activities of the classroom by giving us a sense of security. Knowing what to expect when you're in the room provides a structure that can keep us on task throughout the day. In addition to reviewing our class expectations, we have been participating in a few fun but challenging team-building activities. These activities are great for teaching our students valuable life and teamwork skills, such as patience, communication, and empathy. Team building can also help students increase their selfconfidence in order to voice their thoughts in front of friends. And finally, as children bond and interact with each other, they learn to become more cohesive.

Looking ahead: In ELA, students will continue to use their reading strategies to help them translate print to meaning. Our first unit in reading will focus on using text features and recognizing how they contribute to the meaning of a reading passage, summarizing informational texts, and using context clues to determine the meaning of unknown words. In math, students will complete problems using volume. In social studies, students will use maps to identify the physical features of the United States and review Florida history. In science, students will look closely at the universe. Please continue to check and sign your child's planner every day. Students are expected to read for 30 minutes each night; however, the planner will also show any additional homework and other class information.

#### S.T.E.M.:

Hiiiiiii! I'm Ms. Clark and I teach STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Math) to kindergarten through fifth grade students at Kingsway. Science is my favorite. (3) It's been an awesome start!!!



STEM Lab is bustling with science enthusiasm! Students spent the first week of school learning the rules and procedures of my classroom. We also discussed strategies for working with a partner and small group. The students applied these strategies to build their towers. We have a super creative group of Cougars!



Kindergarten and some VE classes practiced classifying objects by their properties. You can practice this skill at home by having your child classify objects by color, texture, and shape. If they find other ways to classify, send me a picture!

For the next few weeks, students will work on data collection methods as they make observations using science tools. We will work with thermometers, balance scales, and rulers!

Kingsway Cougars will participate in the Moment of Science soon too! The Moment of Science is a daily video on morning announcements focusing on some of our science inquiry words. We will also have science questions to help with test prep. You can find the practice presentation I created for the students in my Canvas Course. A great conversation starter after school would be to ask your child what they wrote in their journal. You can also encourage your child to practice these words at home. If you're enjoying some time outdoors, you can ask your child what they observe (with their eyes and ears). Encourage them to use the word in a sentence when they reply to you. 

# VARYING EXCEPTIONALITIES CLASSES

The Varying Exceptionalities (VE) Team has had a great start to the school year!

- In Mrs. Carthy's Champions Prek class, we are working on what it means to be a kingsway Cougar. We are practicing our leadership by developing learning behaviors and cooperative learning. We are working hard on our fine motor skills and our ability to share. In math, we are practicing our number recognition and sorting skills. In ELA, we are learning letter sounds and identification. We are integrating the arts into our literacy lessons every week. In September, we are starting a unit on balls. We will be investigating different kinds of balls to see if they roll or bounce. We will continue learning what it means to be PAWsitive champions by showing friendliness and determination.
- In Ms. Bolam's Kindergarten and 1st grade class, we've been working very hard on learning how to follow classroom procedures while creating fun and easy-to-follow routines. In ELA, we have been working on letter/sound recognition and rhyming sounds, and we're learning how to decode new words. We have been learning a variety of skills in math, including number recognition, sorting/grouping, number patterns, and addition. Coming in September, students will be learning about plants and animals and what they need to survive. For social studies, we have been talking about what it means to be a part of a community, and the jobs that community helpers have. In everything that we do, we're learning how to be kind and respectful to our fellow classmates:)
- In Mrs. Awad's I-2 grade class, we've been learning about how to be cougar leaders and how to apply classroom rules and routines. In ELA, we are learning how to use our phonics knowledge to blend and decode words. In September, 1st grade will learn how plants and animals grow and change. For 2nd grade, we will learn about plants and animals in their habitats. In math, we are practicing math fluency facts. In September, 1st grade will be learning about number patterns and 2nd grade will be learning about place value to 1,000 and patterns within numbers. In science, 1st grade will be learning about living things and 2nd grade will be learning about the earth's surface and weather. In social studies, 1st and 2nd grade will be learning about our community as well as similarities and differences between rules and responsibilities at home and school. Our students are working hard on treating everyone with kindness and respect to establish our class community. We take pride in being Champions and never giving up.

# VARYING EXCEPTIONALITIES CLASSES continued

- In Mrs. Rosado's and Ms. Liszak's classes, we have been enjoying getting to know our 3rd-5th grade classmates while learning the rules and routines of our classroom. We've already started to dig into Social Studies with our Studies Weekly newspapers. In September, we are reading about Earth Science in ELA. 3rd grade's first unit is Animal Adaptations, 4th grade's is Observing Nature, and 5th grade's is Cultivating Natural Resources. In science, 3rd grade students will learn that Earth is home to a great diversity of living things. They will understand that living things interact with and depend on each other and their environment to satisfy their basic needs. Students in 4th grade will investigate the variation in life cycles among organisms, and find that the reproductive stage exists in the life cycles of all organisms. Students in 5th grade will understand that everything in the world is made of matter and that matter takes up space and has mass. They will learn to classify objects and substances by their physical and chemical properties. In math, students in 3rd grade are learning about place value and number relationships. We are learning how to represent 4-digit numbers, and we are learning strategies to compose, decompose, compare, order, and round 4-digit numbers. Students in 4th grade are also learning about place value and how to use place value to compare and round multi-digit numbers. Students in 5th grade are learning how to calculate volume and use volume formulas to solve real-world problems. Our students are working hard to show leadership skills as proud Kingsway champions! Have your champion reflect on his daily learning by asking the following questions: What did you learn today? How do you and your teacher know if you know it? Help your champion at home by scheduling time for them to read and practice math facts nightly. Also, please make sure to sign up for our Remind class using code @kes3-5.
- Wyman's class has been learning about America's symbols such as the eagle, the U.S. flag, and the Statue of Liberty in social studies. In science, will are learning how plants and animals grow and change. We have also been completing the beginning-of-year assessments. In

English, we have been working on reading comprehension questions, sight words, and letter recognition. In math, our class has been working on addition, subtraction, time, money, color, and

classifying shapes.

FortifyFL is a suspicious activity reporting tool that allows individuals to submit tips concerning unsafe, potentially harmful, dangerous, violent, or criminal activities and threats. That information goes immediately and directly to appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials.


