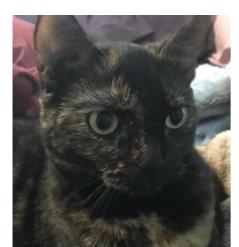

Grading Policy

Quarter grades will be based on the points earned in the following categories:

- •50% tests (can't use notes)
- •25% knowledge checks (can use notes)
- •25% homework and class work

Semester grades follow the county policy of 35% for quarter one, 35% for quarter two, and 30% for the EOC.

For GPA Points, honors classes are weighted 0.5 more than regular classes

Biology EOC

- The Biology EOC is a computer-based assessment that is given to every biology student in the state of Florida.
- The student must "pass" the EOC to graduate with scholars designation on their diploma.
- The EOC is given in May and will count for 30% of your final course grade (both semester 1 & 2 exam grades).
- This means your semester grades won't be determined until after your EOC grades are entered in FOCUS by the county (June or July).

Science Fair

Common questions from students:

Is there a lot of homework?

For most assignments, you are given time in class to get started. How much you need to do at home depends on how well you know the content and how focused you are while working in class.

▶ Is the class hard?

Honors biology class averages are usually in the mid 80's. Most students find tests to be the most challenging. Possibly because this class is likely their first science class that involves analysis and application of content rather than rote memorization.

▶ Is the EOC hard?

The EOC is challenging and covers the whole year. However, data from the past five years shows that above 95% of honors biology students pass the EOC.

Do we dissect animals?

Yes, dissection is after the EOC. We usually have both frogs and rats available for dissection. There is also a virtual option available.
