Bullying

- Bullying occurs when a person or group of people hurts, embarrasses or frightens (**psychological, physical, verbal**) another person repeatedly
- Three characters in a bullying situation: *Victim, Bully and Bystander*



Definition of Bullying/Harassment

- Bullying/Harassment means physically, verbally or emotionally hurting, embarrassing, frightening someone
- It is unprovoked, repeated, intentional
- Difference in power, physical or psychological

- Choice of Friends



Exclusion

- Judging someone
- Appearance
- Cultural difference
- Opinions

What a Student can do if they are being Bullied?

Be SAFE

- Say something to an adult
- Ask for help
- Find a friend
- Exit the area



How To Be A Friend

- Refuse to join in
- Never fight the bully
- Get others to help you speak out against the bullying
- Report all bullying to an adult/administration



Ways For Students To Report

- Verbal report to any adult
- Written report to any adult
- Anonymous report: use online school/district website - the *Bully Button*

What is Cyber Bullying?

- Harassments, Insults, Threats, Name-Calling, etc.
- Provoking Fights (inciting violence)
- Gossiping, Spreading Rumors, etc.
- Pretending to be Someone Else



Tools for Cyber Bullying

- Cell Phones; Text Messages; Cell Phone Photos; Instant Messaging; Snap Chat; Tweeting
- Email
- Online Games
- Facebook; Blogs
- Profile Pages
 - Including creating a false profile pretending to be someone else
- Video Games



How to be Safe on the Internet

- Know with whom you are talking
- Do not give your passwords to just anybody; change passwords
- Think about what you say on the internet
- Do not post pictures of yourself
- If need be, get off Facebook or cell phone for a couple weeks - be proactive



Internet Safety

- Remember once you put something out on the internet, it is there forever



Issue: Getting Students/Parents to initially report an incident of Bullying and the notification to school administration if the problem persists.

School Solution: The creation of safety plans for the victim and the bully. Safety plans include "status checks" with the school counselor.
