- If your student has had a fever or diarrhea they must remain home until free of symptoms for 24 hours.
- If your student needs medication at school (This includes cough drops, inhalers, ibuprofen, etc.), please be sure we have a medication authorization on file. You can obtain that form from the office, the district website, or your child's doctor.
- At age 11 students should receive a tetanus booster, called tDap, at their annual check-up. Please note this immunization is required once they reach 7th grade. Find more information here

SUMMER MATH CAMP


WHO: All incoming students entering 6th-8th grade.
