Orin Smith Families,





Once a week, every week, for the entire school year Mrs. Sande's 3rd graders are participating in a nature walk. Just like last year, Room 202 has claimed the little patch of woods behind the middle school as their very own classroom. Each week the students spend about 45 minutes in the woods armed with nature journals, pencils, and hand lenses. The focus is a little different with each visit and is usually based on the students' interests and discoveries from the prior week. Some of the topics explored so far have been insects, spiders and oak trees, but along the way frogs, gingko trees, garter snakes, a praying mantis or two, a friendly neighborhood cat, and snowberries have all joined in the fun. The outdoor classroom is a perfect place to build skills such as paying attention to details, asking questions, predicting and making connections, and simply learning to be naturalists.












4th Grade Music:
