


Mission



The AVID Program

What is AVID?

- AVID stands for <u>A</u>dvancement
 Via Individual Determination.
- AVID is an in-school college readiness program for grades 9-12 that prepares students for college eligibility and success.
- AVID supports students in advanced classes with weekly tutorials embedded in their school day.
- AVID is for all students, but it targets students who meet specific criteria.
- AVID is implemented school wide.

What AVID is NOT!

- AVID is not a remedial program
- AVID is not a free ride
- AVID is not a niche program
- AVID is not a college outreach program
- AVID is not an at-risk program

Who Should Choose AVID?

- Highly Motivated
- First generation or limited college experience
- Historically underserved in 4 year colleges
- Special circumstances

CHHS AVID Program

CHHS AVID is a four-year commitment. Each year emphasizes developmental instruction to preparing students for academic success and college acceptance.

9th- High school adjustment and goal setting/four-year plan/note taking/tutorials/public speaking

10th- Major and career exploration

11th- Exploring university pathways and refining college options

12th- University admission process/Life skills

AVID students are supported by a Site Team consisting of a coordinator, administrator, a counselor, AVID elective teachers, subject area teachers, college tutors. All trained in AVID methodologies and strategies that serve a vital resource within the AVID elective class.
