1. Welcome and Introductions

The meeting was called to order via zoom at 4:05 p.m. by Denver Stairs.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes from the April 22, 2021 meeting was approved. David motioned to approve the minutes. Dea seconded the motion. The minutes have been approved as presented.

2. Public Comments

3. 2020 Bond Project List/Bond Tracker Report

Cherie reviewed the Bond Project List with the committee and summarized how the \$335 million dollar bond has been allocated throughout the bond. The total cost to complete projects on the 2020 Bond Project List is \$376 million dollars. Other revenues such as deferred maintenance, developer fees and Prop. 51 funds will be used to cover the difference in cost for these projects.

As of August of 2021, the District has spent \$50 million of the \$335 million and has accrued \$55,000 dollars in interest.

Scott asked about how the district will provide updates on project timelines. Denver explained that summer 2021 projects will be completed by August of 2021 and summer 2022 projects will be complete by August of 2022 with the exception of the Terry Bradley Educational Center (this is a 5-year project). Denver also informed the committee that progress pictures of each project will be shown at its quarterly meetings.

 - o Pending completion
- Clovis West Pool
 - o In design, scheduled to be completed mid fall 2022

 - o Pending completion
