WHAT IS CSI? (CLOVIS SUPPORT AND INTERVENTION)



-Certified Facilitators/Caring Adults help students in support groups



-Students with any life challenges are placed in a support group



-Students can discuss concerns and have someone listen to them without judgement



-Students learn how to listen, the value of listening, communication & gain coping skills in all areas of their life and are more able to focus in the classroom for success

WHAT CSI IS NOT?

- -It is not your RSP, 504 students only (typically)
- -It is not a group for just outcast or discipline kids
- -It is not therapy, it's an educational support group
- It is NOT only our transition kids, but could include them

 *There may be other specific intervention groups, that are great interventions, however they are different than CSI groups (ex: social skills group run by our psychologists)

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR CSI?

- -Any student facing a life challenge/current issue that you may or may not be aware of.
 - Divorce
 - Stress/Pressure
 - Withdrawn/Quiet
 - Overactive/Attention seeking
 - Bullying
 - Death
 - Incarcerated or unavailable parent
 - Family member with Serious Illness
 - Just moved here
 - Everyone....just like you and me © Students struggling as a result of the last 18 months

WHO ARE OUR FACILITATORS AT CW?



- -8 week sessions (same day/time each week)
- -2 facilitators will run a group during half of a block period.
 In rare circumstances groups can be held on a regular period.
- -EVERYTHING in group is confidential and cannot be shared.
- Our goal is to have multiple groups running at one time.
- Groups usually start whenever 6 or more students are placed into one.

HOW THE PROCESS WORKS


- You do not need to discuss CSI with your student before you make a referral, but you may do so if you are close to the student.
- I screen students, telling them that someone on campus who cares about them thought they would benefit from participating in a CSI group.
- Students are placed into an appropriate group and will miss half a block period for 8 weeks. Students are not excused from work and are still expected to make up class activities.
- When in doubt, refer!




HOW DO I REFER A STUDENT TO CSI?

- -You should get a page that says your referral was received after submitting...if you do not, please double check that you did not leave any boxes blank...






BENEFITS AND GOALS OF CSI
