From the program, to the setting, to the vibe: each of our nine undergraduate campuses has something different to offer.

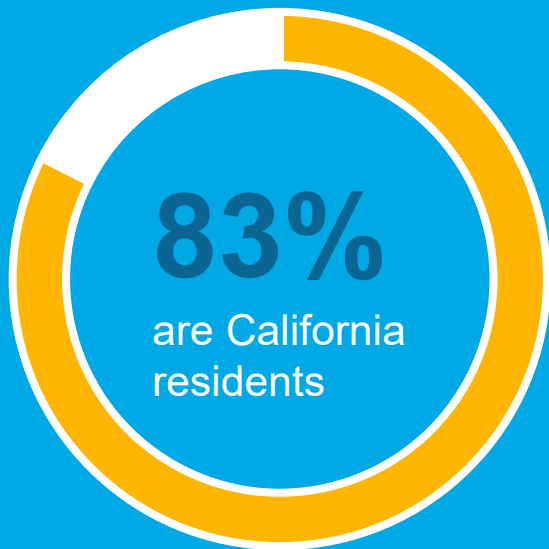
But no matter which campus you choose, you'll find a culture of academic excellence, and fellow students and faculty who'll inspire you every day.

## Choosing a UC campus

### To find your fit within UC, consider...

- Does the campus have a **major** in which I'm interested?
- What **resources and support programs** are available to me and others like me?
- What campus **environment** is best for me?



## Applying to UC

### Nine campuses, one application

- Opens August 1
- Select which campuses you'd like to receive your UC application
- \$80 fee for each UC campus (\$95 for international applicants)
- Fee waiver available for up to four campuses for qualified students





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# Freshman admission

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## Applying as a freshman

### You'll start as a freshman if...

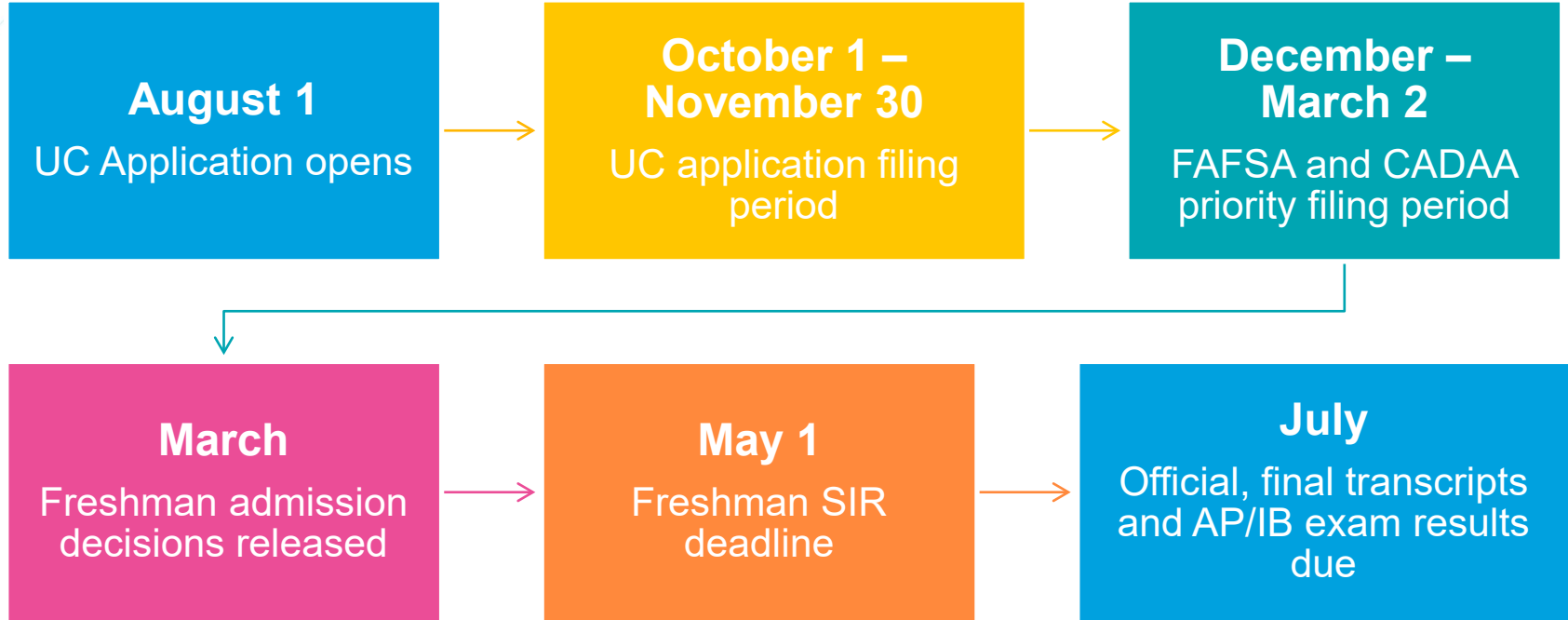
You're currently in high school

**OR**

You've graduated high school, but haven't enrolled in a regular session (fall, winter, spring) at a college or university.

You are still considered a freshman applicant even if you have earned college credit while in high school.

A-G courses**



**Earn a UC GPA  
of 3.0 or better  
(3.4 for  
nonresidents)**





## A-G subject requirements

### A-G requirements

- Complete a minimum of **15** A-G courses with a grade of C or better
- Prior to beginning your last year of high school, you must complete 11 of these courses

**Note:** UC will accept Pass or Credit grades in A-G courses completed in spring 2020 through summer 2021 to meet A-G requirements.

- A. History** – 2 years
- B. English** – 4 years
- C. Mathematics** – 3 years (*4 years recommended*)
- D. Science** – 2 years (*3 years recommended*)
- E. Language other than English** – 2 years (*3 years recommended*)
- F. Visual and performing arts** – 1 year
- G. College-preparatory elective** – 1 year

### UC GPA minimum requirement

- California residents: **3.0**
- Non-residents: **3.4**

Students should aim to exceed this minimum requirement to be a competitive applicant.

### How the UC GPA is calculated

- Includes all letter grades from A-G courses taken during grades 10 and 11 (including the summers after 9–11)
- Grade points are based on the letter grade received; plus (+) and minus (-) grades are not factored
- Up to 8 semesters of extra points are added for passed AP, IB, college-level or UC-approved honors courses

## Minimum requirements versus selection

### Minimum requirements

- A-G coursework
- UC GPA minimum
- Consistent for all campuses

### Selection

- Comprehensive review (13 factors)
- Varies by campus

## Learning more about you: Activities & awards

### Activities and awards can include:

- Awards or honors
- Educational preparation programs
- Extracurricular activities
- Coursework other than A-G
- Volunteer/community service
- Work experience

- Respond to 4 of the 8 prompts
- All questions hold equal value
- 350 words maximum per response
- Focus on the content, not the style, of your writing
- May be used for admission and scholarship consideration

## Course requirement

### 7-course pattern

- Complete the seven-course pattern with a grade of C (or equivalent) or better in each course

It is recommended that you complete math and English as early as possible.

- **Two** transferable courses in English Composition
- **One** transferable course in mathematical concepts and quantitative reasoning
- **Four** transferable college courses chosen from at least two of the following subject areas:
  - Arts and humanities
  - Social and behavioral sciences
  - Physical and biological sciences



## Unit requirement

### Junior standing

- Complete 60 semester (90 quarter) units of UC-transferable college credit
- No more than 14 semester (21 quarter) units may be taken Pass/No Pass
  - *See next slide for Pass/No Pass grading exceptions*







## Pass/Credit grading exceptions

### Pass/Credit maximum

- All Pass and Credit grades earned in winter–summer 2020 are excluded from the 14 semester/21 quarter unit maximum of Pass/Credit grades

### Pass/Credit for major preparation

- All campuses will accept Pass or Credit grades earned in spring 2020 for major prep courses for all majors **except** Psychology and Cognitive Science majors at Santa Cruz

Students should check with each campus regarding the usage of Pass or Credit grades for major prep courses beyond spring 2020.



## Transfer GPA

### GPA minimum requirement

- California residents: **2.4**
- Non-residents: **2.8**

Students should aim to exceed this minimum requirement to be a competitive applicant.

### How the transfer GPA is calculated

- Includes all UC-transferable units attempted, including college courses completed while in high school
- Grade points are based on the letter grade received; plus (+) and minus (-) grades are recognized
- Academic Renewal (AR), Pass/No Pass, Credit/No Credit, Satisfactory/Non-Satisfactory, Excused Withdrawal (EW), and/or Withdrawal are not included in the GPA calculation

## Eligibility versus selection

### Major Preparation

- Certain majors may have required or recommended coursework
- Consider taking courses from other CCCs or online UC-transferable courses if your CCC doesn't offer a major preparation course
- Take full course sequences at one CCC

### GPA

- Meet or exceed the minimum transfer GPA
- For selective majors, a strong GPA is especially important

### IGETC

- Not required for admission; may be recommended for certain campuses/majors
- Full or partial certification is available

## Learning more about you: PIQs

### Personal Insight Questions (PIQs)

- One required question; respond to 3 of the other 7 questions
- All questions hold equal value
- 350 words maximum per response
- Focus on the content, not the style, of your writing
- May be used for admission and scholarship consideration

### Required PIQ for transfers:

Please describe how you have prepared for your intended major, including your readiness to succeed in your upper-division courses once you enroll at the university.




## Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG)

### What is TAG?

A guarantee for admission to a participating campus and a major, so long as all deadlines and requirements are met.

### To be eligible for TAG, students must:

- ✓ Transfer from a California Community College (CCC)
- ✓ Complete over half of their units at the CCC
- ✓ Last attend a CCC before transfer



Students with non-CCC coursework and international students with a F1 or J1 visa can also be eligible for TAG



## Systemwide TAG requirements

Complete **30** UC-transferable semester units by **September 30**

Complete **60** UC-transferable semester units by **spring** prior to transfer

Complete **UC-E and UC-M**

Meet **GPA** criteria (2.7–3.5) which varies by campus and major

Review campus-specific **major requirements**

# UC Transfer Pathways and Pathways+

## UC Transfer Pathways

A common set of courses that provide uniform major preparation for majors associated with each pathway, at each UC campus.

## Pathways+

Completion of a UC Transfer Pathway plus the Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG).





# Transfer Admission Planner (TAP)

## Welcome to UC TAP

### Getting started

Here are a few tips to help you use the planner:

- As you plan and complete your college coursework, make sure to update the planner with your most current information and be sure to keep your contact information up to date.
- The planner has three main sections for you to complete: About me, My Academic History, and My transfer plan.
- Check the Messages section often: This is where you'll receive important reminders or other communication from either your community college or UC staff.
- At any time, you can click "Record Review" to see all of the information you've entered.

Each incoming class will have a set tuition

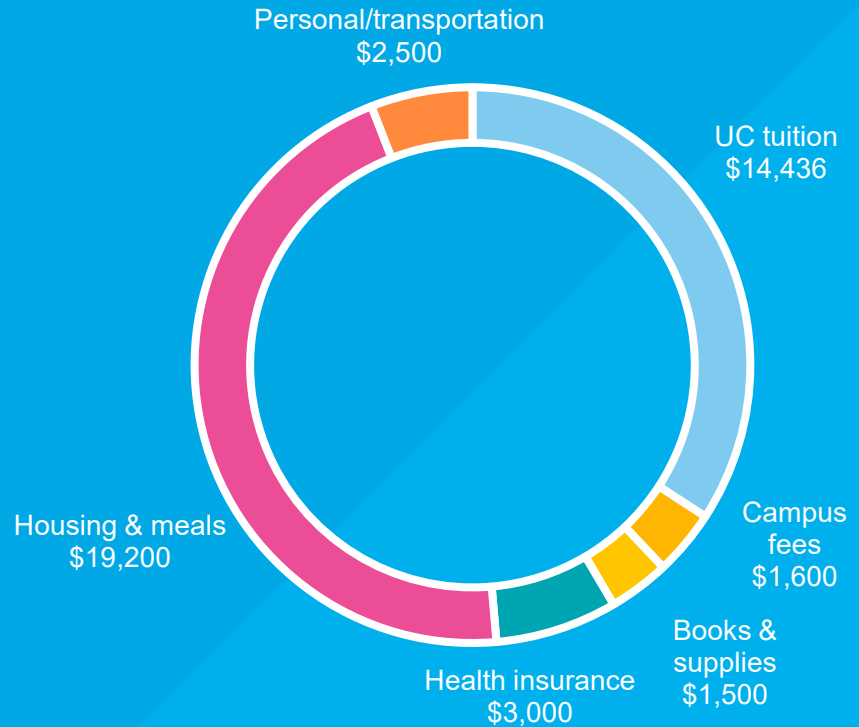
### Up to six years

## Cost of attendance

For California residents, the estimated average cost for a new student living on campus in 2024–25 is **\$42,236**.

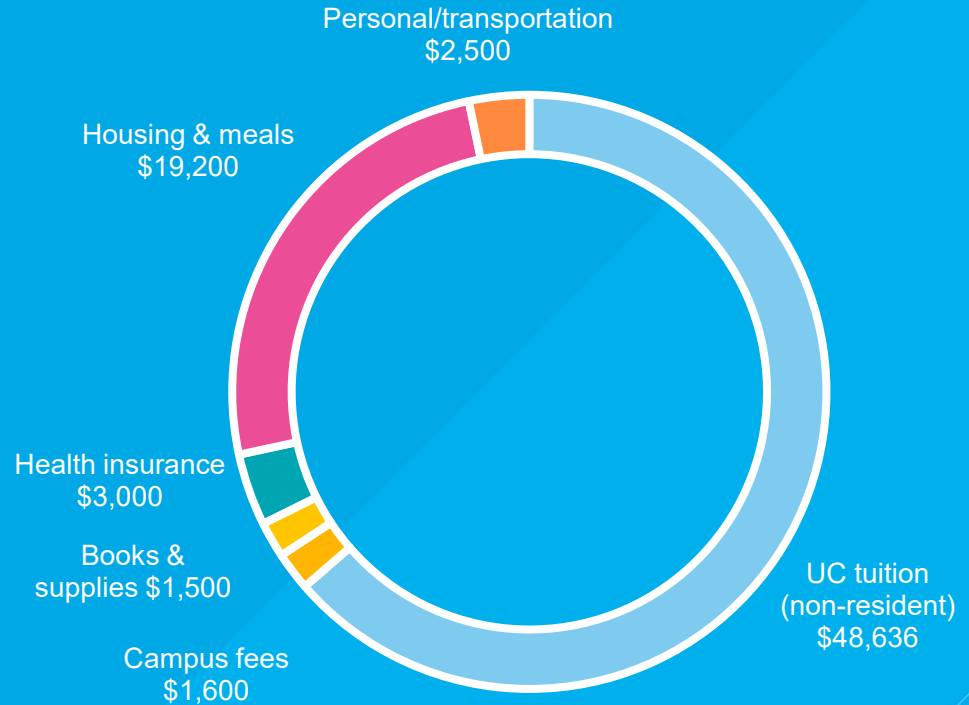
However, most students do not pay the full cost of attendance.



## Nonresident cost of attendance

For non-California residents, the estimated average cost for a new student living on campus in 2024–25 is **\$76,436**.

Limited financial aid is available for nonresident undergraduates attending UC.

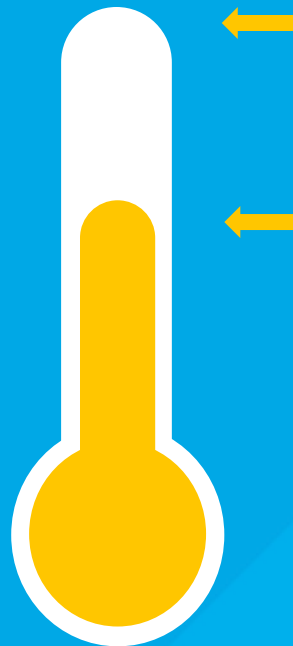
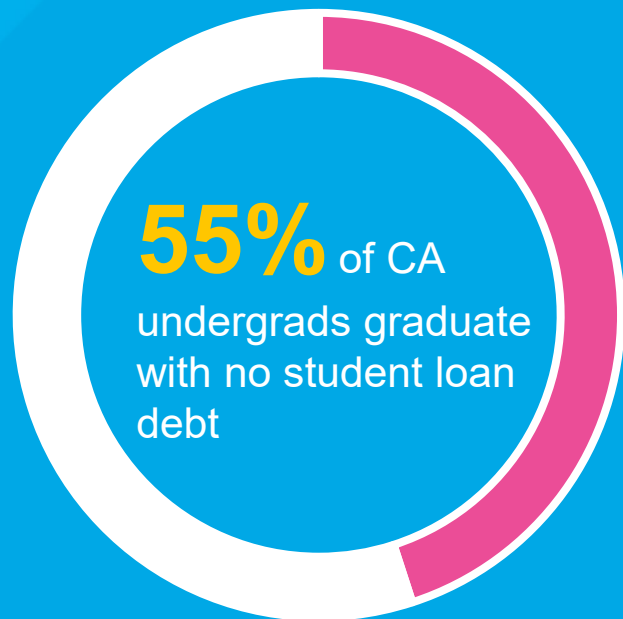
## UC financial aid programs

For California residents who are eligible for financial aid and with a family income less than **\$80,000**, the Blue and Gold Opportunity Plan can cover the cost of your tuition, with extra funds available.

For California residents with family income and assets less than **\$217,000**, California's Middle Class Scholarship may provide scholarships to help with paying for college costs.
