Drug & Alcohol Education and Treatment

Clovis Police Department (559) 324-2440

The Drug Education Program is a five-hour class provided one Saturday a month during the school year and is taught by a Clovis Police Officer. The class is interactive and teaches juveniles the dangers and consequences of alcohol and drug use. Meets most of the drug education requirements for stipulations required by CUSD. No charge for class.

Al-Anon / Alateen (888) 425-2666

Young people aged 13 to 18 who have been affected by someone else's drinking al-anon.org. No charge for services, even have chat with staff online through the website.

My Time Recovery (559) 550-2809

Offers residential and day treatment programs.

Housing

Fresno Housing Authority

Assist low-income families with Housing Choice Voucher Program (formerly Section 8), affordable housing apartments (listed on their website). Waiting lists open occasionally.

Sanctuary Youth Services (559) 498-8543

Emergency shelter for individuals 18-24.

MAP (Multi-Agency Access Program) (559) 512-6777

Connects individuals facing housing, substance abuse, physical health, or mental illness challenges to supportive services.

Mental Health Services

Fresno County Mental Health (559) 600-8919

Families can drop by 3133 N. Millbrook, any time between 8 and 4PM to fill out a packet and will meet with an Admitting Interviewer for Medi-Cal clearance. Must have Medi-Cal, they do not take private insurance.

Saint Agnes Footsteps Program for Grief and Loss (559) 450-5608

Supports children, teens and adults who have experienced a loss due to death. The 6-week small group program is held four times a year (Feb, April, Aug & Oct) on Thursday evenings from 5:30-6:20 p.m. at Saint Agnes Home Health and Hospice, 6729 N. Willow Ave., Suite 103, Fresno. No charge but must register for the classes.

Fresno Survivors of Suicide Loss (SOSL) through Hinds Hospice (559) 248-8579

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Grief support group for survivors of suicide. The 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month free to attend.

Ascend Adolescent Behavioral Health (559) 472-3371

Mental Health Counseling for Kids, Teens & Families. Provides intensive outpatient services. Does not accept Medi-Cal.

Central Star Behavioral Health (559) 840-4937

Youth Psychiatric Health Facility Serving the Central Valley. Takes both Medi-cal and some private insurances.

Exodus Recovery, Inc. (559) 512-8700

Exodus Fresno Mental Health Crisis Stabilization Unit (CSU) is a youth crisis facility that assesses for stabilization services, medication evaluation and management, or hospitalization if necessary.

River Vista Behavioral Health (559) 603-6000

Treats mental health issues in children and adolescents from ages 5 to 17, as well as adults and senior adults. Offers inpatient and outpatient programs including partial hospitalizations.

Crisis Intervention

Marjorie Mason Center (559) 233-4357

Domestic violence shelter that provides emergency and longer-term Safe Housing, counseling, legal advocacy and crisis support.

The 988 Lifeline provides 24/7, free and confidential support for people in distress, prevention and crisis resources for you or your loved ones, and best practices for professionals in the United States.

Employment and Training

Workforce Connection (559)230-4440

Employment Services for Young Adults 14-24. Interview preparation workshops, work experience opportunities and job placement assistance.

Local Conservation Corps (559) 264-1048

Proves young adults (ages 18-25) with job training and educational opportunities.

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California Conservation Corps (559) 458-0914

The CCC is a one-year full-time program young adults 18 – 25 years old. Corpsmembers work on environmental projects and respond to natural and man-made disasters, residential and nonresidential.

Job Corp (415) 937-2590

Job Corps Information Session Every Tuesday @ 10am, Workforce Connection (Manchester Mall), no appointment necessary. Job training vocational programs and high school/GED for youth 16 to 24. Job Corps also offers career planning, on-the-job training, job placement, residential housing, food service, driver's education, health and dental care, a bi-weekly basic living allowance, and a clothing allowance.
