I have been in education for 38 years and at Liberty for 17. Some people ask, "Don't you get bored?" I tell them no, because every day is an adventure. Learning is very valuable for me, because it eliminates my confusion and struggles. Learning helps me succeed in life, which makes it like treasure. If I get up in the morning and I say, I don't have anything to learn, or I don't have to get better at something, then there's no treasure map for the day. When there is nothing valuable to search for, there's nothing to discover. When you cease being a student in life, the adventure ends. This is at the core of our Positivity Character Strength for the month, the Love of Learning.

For example, when a teacher comes up to me and says that she is struggling to get her students to listen during class, the teacher gives me an adventure. The treasure is, What if the teacher and I figure a way to get the students to want to listen, and then they learn all this wonderful stuff from the teacher? How cool would that be !? When I face challenges at school, I tell myself, I'm on an adventure, from a starting point of my ignorance and incompetence, and I will journey to find treasure, a point of understanding and success. When I get others to join my adventure, it gets even more fun.

If a misbehaving student comes into the office, adventure is on. How do I identify what is making this student behave poorly and how do I help turn the student's attitude and behavior around, *getting him going in the right direction?* These are the adventures that cause this 62-year-old man with 38 years of experience in education to go to school with passion and purpose.

I have discovered that when I stop being a student, life loses adventure. On the other hand, when I see every day filled with opportunities to learn, I go to my job to explore and search for treasure. Believe me, at a school with over 600 students, over 50 staff members, and over a thousand parents, guardians, and significant others, there's an overabundance of adventures for treasure.

CUSD Dress Code Reminders:

- Tops that expose the midriff are not acceptable. ٠
- No frayed or unhemmed jeans or shorts.
- ٠ Shoulder straps on tops need to be at least 2 inches wide.
- Shoes must have a heel or back strap, no slides or flip-flops.
- Shorts length must be 5 inches above knee or at ٠ least mid-thigh - whichever is longer, and they must be hemmed.
- Leggings are allowed if over garment reaches 5 ٠ inches above knee or mid-thigh - whichever is longer.
- ٠ Hair which causes undue attention is not acceptable, such as unusual colors (Kool-aid or dyed hair colors), mohawks, tails or razor cuts.
- Hats are to be removed indoors.
- Any apparel depicting professional sports teams or logos are not acceptable.
