# Maple Creek Elementary S.A.R.T. Meeting MINUTES

Monday, September 16th, 2024

- Mrs. Kismet welcomed and thanked everyone for showing interest in joining our SART meeting. She
  explained what SART is and the structure for meetings across the district (district-area-site meetings.
  She invited any parent that would be interested to email her and that they could participate in either
  area or district meetings. Mrs. Kismet highlighted the importance of SART and that it is a good way to
  stay connected with the school.
- 2. An update of the campus was shared. Maple Creek was recognized with the highest level of recognition Platinum on the CA PBIS Award. The school year is off to an incredibly smooth start, students and staff alike continue to speak highly of all things going on. Parents were thanked for their support of our Fitness Frenzy, and we raised just over 24,000 which are ASB funds. Mrs. Kismet provided information on the use and restrictions with respect to ASB funding and mentioned Fitness Frenzy is our only ASB fundraiser. Parents were informed that we are purchasing new track and cross-country uniforms that will cost just over \$9,000.
- 3. Parent Square was shared with parents. Mrs. Kismet highlighted how teachers, administration, and coaches are currently using Parent Square. She highlighted the hyperlinks and future use of it for scheduling conferences. Mrs. Kismet Parent Square will handle all of our communication needs with one platform making it easier for parents, parents can also adjust the notifications to suit their preferred communication.
- 4. A presentation regarding the Measure A bond was shared with families. Specific highlights on how the bond would benefit Maple Creek as well as the district were shared. Mrs. Kismet highlighted upgrades for Maple Creek, to mention some roofing, electrical, safety, and MPR. It was stated that approving the bond would not result in an increase in taxes. The presentation also provided information on the rising costs of construction and the need to ensure Clovis Unified continues to maintain equitable facilities from school to school.
- 5. The CUSD Comprehensive Wellness website and the wheel were shared with parents. Mrs. Kismet talked about CSI at Maple Creek, the use of the BCT team, and several of the other interventions / supports that are on the wheel. Mrs. Kismet encouraged parents to get this information out to others if they were in conversation with parents who were looking for resources.

# Since 2012, Maple Creek Elementary School has received the following projects funded by two Measure A facility bonds:

- Expanded library for instructional areas and storage
- Replaced flooring in restrooms and snack bar
- Updated snack bar facility
- · Replaced aging heating systems
- Updated multipurpose room
- Repaired play fields
- Upgraded Heating, Ventilation, Air-conditioning (HVAC) system
- Replaced roofing on entire campus
- Added security cameras
- Repaired and upgraded power distribution system
- Upgraded classroom audio-visual systems
- Implemented lighting efficiency improvements
- Improved exterior lighting
- Upgraded technology network and wireless access
- Replaced plumbing fixtures and upgraded restrooms
- Completed Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) required upgrades



Every school facility in Clovis Unified has benefited from bond projects not once or twice, but many times over. Across the District, bond funds have been used for:



Fixing leaking roofs, electrical wiring, fire safety doors and smoke alarms



Repairing and upgrading deteriorating science, engineering and math classrooms to provide modern learning spaces at all of our schools



Building new schools and adding space at existing schools to reduce overcrowding



Building new performing arts and athletic spaces and upgrading others



Making needed updates to facilities to provide safe, clean drinking water



Improving school safety and security by updating communication systems and security systems



Maintaining equitable facilities at schools of all ages through modernization and maintenance projects



And many, many other upgrades and repairs
