Celebrations Around The World Halloween

Halloween is observed in the United States and the United Kingdom on October 31. Halloween is an old word that means holy and e'en is Scottish for evening. The two words were put together and became Halloween. Some think that the origin of Halloween comes from an ancient Celtic Festival called Samhain.
