SAT/ACT

- ❑ PSAT scores posted in December. You should have received an email from CollegeBoard to create or access your account to view scores.
- ❑ Be sure to check with each college you plan on applying to and see if they require SAT/ACT scores or not when applying.
- ❑ Use code **3594** to send SAT scores to ALL 23 CSU campuses
- ❑ If you send scores to one UC campus, then ALL 10 campuses will have access.

SAT

SAT: Scholastics Aptitude Test

- Contains two sections
 - Math
 - Evidence-Based Reading & Writing
- 3-hour test
- Total score max is 1600
- Fee based: \$55 (fee waivers available for those who qualify)
- Register for the SAT at <http://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/register/dates-deadlines>
- Dates
 - March 12, 2022
 - May 7, 2022
 - June 4, 2022
- SAT is no longer offering Subject Tests or the optional essay

ACT

ACT: American College Testing

- Contains four sections
 - English
 - Reading
 - Math
 - Science
 - Optional 5th section: Writing Test
- 2 hours & 55 minutes test; 3 hours & 35 minutes with writing test
- Total score scale is 1 to 36
- Fee based: \$60 or \$85 with writing test (fee waivers available for those who qualify)

- Dates
 - February 12, 2022
 - April 2, 2022
 - June 11, 2022
 - July 16, 2022

QuestBridge – College Prep Scholars Program

- ▶ National program that provides an advantage in the admission process to top colleges and universities for high-achieving 11th grade students from a low-income background.
- ▶ Many College Prep Scholars are selected as Finalists for the FULLY paid tuition QuestBridge National College Match program during their 12th grade year.
- ▶ Juniors get a head start by being able to fill out full college applications early, in order to receive valuable support & guidance on how to make their application stand out further.
- ▶ College Prep Scholars are eligible for FULL scholarships to college summer programs and the Quest for Excellence Award (an all expenses paid campus visit)
- ▶ The FREE application opens in early February and can be found online at www.questbridge.org/high-school-students/college-prep-scholars
- ▶ For more information about this program, the National College Match program (12th grade), and eligibility for both programs please visit the QuestBridge website.
- ▶ **Deadline to apply will be late March 2022.**

NCAA/NAIA Athletic Eligibility

- ▶ Be sure to check with your counselor to see if you are on track and meeting eligibility requirements.
- ▶ 16 Core Units are needed for Division I & II, and NAIA eligibility
- ▶ One year of a college prep class is equal to one core unit.
- ▶ Send SAT/ACT scores to the NCAA (using code 9999) and the NAIA (using code 9876)
- ▶ Register with the NCAA Eligibility Center and/or NAIA at the end of this school year.
- ▶ Classes that earn core units:
 - ▶ English (P)
 - ▶ Math (P)
 - ▶ Science (P)
 - ▶ Social Science (P)
 - ▶ World Language (P)

Center for Advanced Research & Technology (CART)

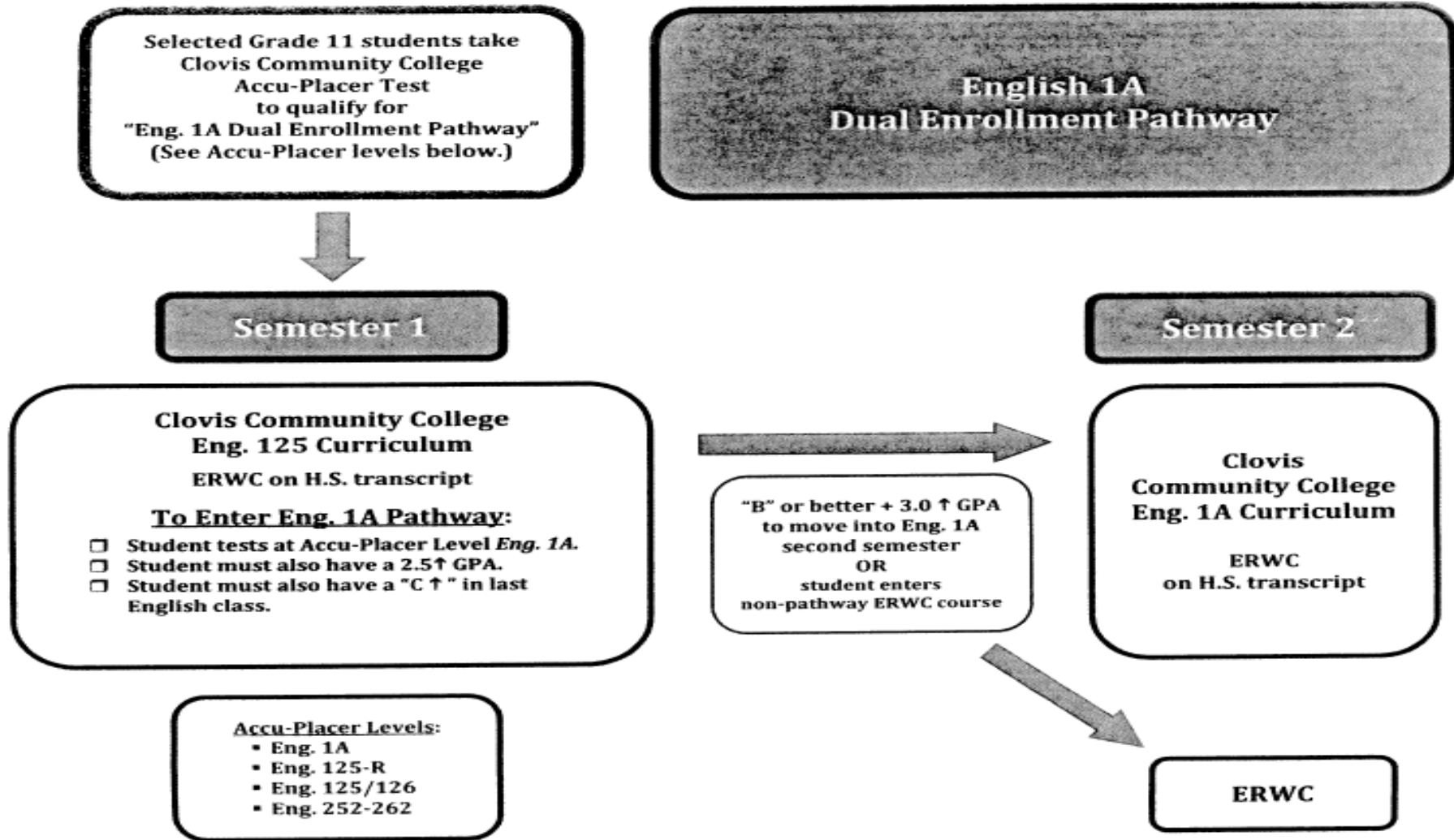
- ▶ Online application opened December 1st at <http://CART.org/>

MONEY MANAGEMENT/ ALGEBRA TOPICS

- ▶ Dual enrolled math class for seniors
 - ▶ Earn high school and college credits at the same time.
 - ▶ Not recommended for seniors who plan on applying to four-year colleges.
- ▶ Must have “C” or better in Math 2 and/or Math 3
- ▶ Must attend Community College summer class INTDS 50
 - ▶ 3 college units will be earned
 - ▶ Most colleges now require an intro college class, and this meets that requirement
 - ▶ This class is FREE

1. Go to Google Classroom

- Download the Google Classroom app on your mobile device or go to the website classroom.google.com (app is preferred so you can get push notifications).
- Make sure you are logged in under your SCHOOL account.

2. Join a Class

- Locate the plus icon in the upper right of the classroom page to enter the join code.
- Enter the code above – RHF7YXS

3. Turn on Notifications

- Locate your settings within the app (usually accessed by clicking the upper left button).
- Go to “notifications” and turn on classroom notifications (email and/or classes you’re enrolled in).

4. Ask if you Need Help

- Come by the Activities Office or ask your teachers to help you with your initial set-up if you are having a hard time getting added.
