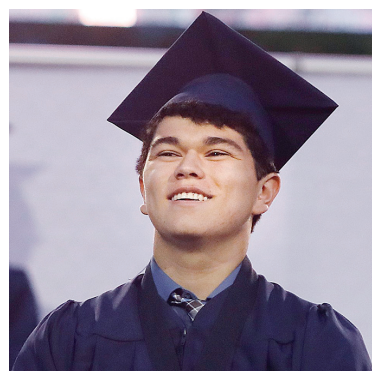

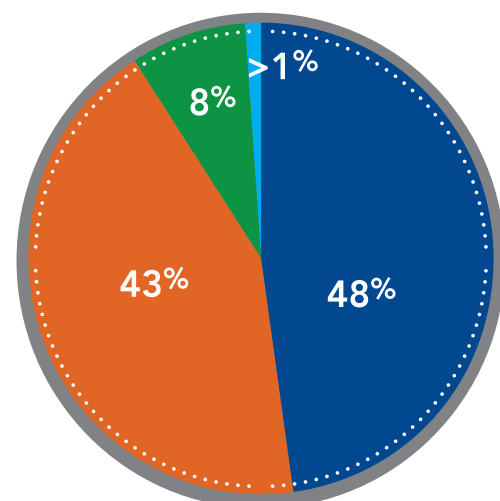

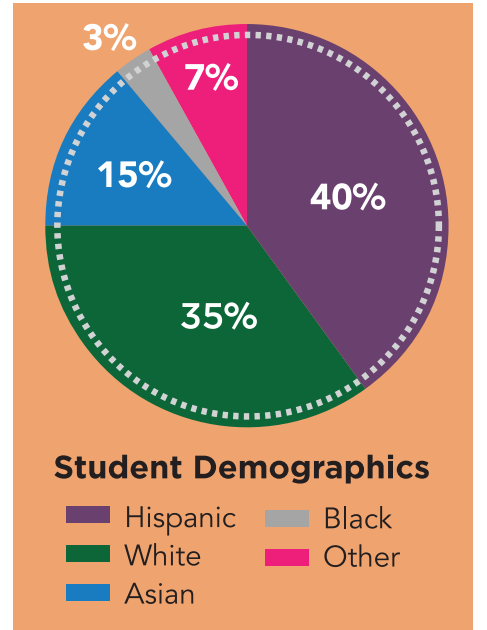

Clovis Unified State Test Scores

Prior to the pandemic, Clovis Unified student state test scores represented: 1st in English/language art and 2nd in math scores out of the Top 20 Largest School District's in California.

During the pandemic, state testing was halted. It resumed in Spring 2022 for grades 3-8 and 11. Individual scores have been shared with parents, and teachers are using these to direct instruction.

Our Mission
 To be a quality educational system providing the resources for ALL students to reach their potential in **mind, body** and **spirit.**

MIND. BODY.

- **97.2%** graduation rate
- **96%** of parents say their child's school provides a quality education.
- Secondary campuses provide academic counselors, tutoring and college and career centers. Other **resources** are offered through Supplemental Services and Special Education departments.
- **84%** of students say their teachers care if they do well in school.
- Clovis Unified high schools have 29 **Advanced Placement classes** that provide students college level instruction. 4,638 AP tests were taken by Clovis Unified students for college credit with a passage rate of 70%.
- Every elementary school library has a **reading room**. Students also have access to computer labs and VR headsets for virtual exploration and learning of far-away places.
- **21 Career Technical Education (CTE)** pathways are offered, including patient care, education, farming, construction and engineering. 3,705 students are enrolled.

- **Physical Education** is included in students' class schedules every year through high school.
- **4.75 million meals** served to students. Clovis Unified Campus Catering plans nutritious meals, makes its own bread and muffins from scratch and uses fresh farm-grown local and state produce.
- Schools **offer a wide range of sports**, starting in fourth grade. About 70% of students say they participate in school athletic teams.
- At each high school, **Unified Sports** are offered where general and special education athletes compete together in league play.
- **83% of students** say they feel like they are a part of their school.
- **Keeping our students safe is a priority**, and Clovis Unified has 16 sworn police officers who are POST – Police Officer Standards and Training – certified. There is a dedicated officer on each secondary campus and a team of officers serving elementary schools. Extensive safety plans are in place at every site.

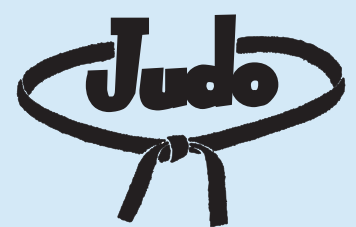

Our 4-year-old transitional kindergarteners, who follow a typical academic path, will graduate from college in the year 2040!



- 87% of parents say schools have a **positive environment**.
- 93% of students say they can get help at school when they need it.
- Clovis Unified has a pro-active **Wellness Support System** that includes Clovis Support and Intervention (CSI), Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS), Behavior Consultation Team (BCT), Multi-Tiered Systems of Support, Transition Team, Community Behavior Partnership with All 4 Youth and Comprehensive Youth Services, Suicide Prevention and Social-Emotional Support Providers.
- **Diversity** is celebrated at each campus through classroom lessons, multi-cultural festivals and heritage clubs. The district holds annual leadership conferences spotlighting African-American, Asian and Latino mentors.
- **Three out of four students** say they are involved in extra school activities such as sports, drama, band, dance, science fair, robotics and clubs.
- **3,176** soprano recorders and curriculum were purchased for fourth graders who all study music.



Quite literally, our community's future leaders, decisions-makers and contributors are sitting in our classrooms right now. We do not take this responsibility lightly.

Clovis Unified intentionally hires and develops teachers who are caring and committed to providing an exemplary education to our students, and we challenge our entire staff (6,000-plus!) to use their area of expertise to make a positive impact on our

students' lives.

Whether it is a bus driver warmly welcoming a child each morning, a librarian building a robust literary collection or a buyer ensuring supplies arrive on time, every member of our team shares the same goal to do the best we can for our kids.

We believe by putting students first, we are paving the way for them to become successful today — *and tomorrow* — in mind, body and spirit!



INNOVATION & INSPIRATION: Our Child Development Expanded Learning Opportunities Program developed a brand new program this year that will bring a deeper-dive into art lessons for TK and kindergarten students. ELOP instructors will have immersive sessions at the Fresno Art Museum, viewing the exhibitions and holding discussions, that will then result in engaging lessons for students to tap into their artistic creativity. Our team's innovative concept found supporting partners in the museum and Fresno County Office of Education.

SPOTTING THE POTENTIAL: Passionate teachers, like Buchanan High's video instructor Dan Pearce, help their students to aim high, to challenge themselves and to give their best efforts on their projects. The fruitful rewards result in successful collaborations, increased learning, and in the case of Pearce's students, 10 Emmy Awards this past year from the Northern California Chapter of the National Academy of Television and Science! Yep, those Emmys. "I can't wait to see what their future holds," he said.



TECHNOLOGY TOOLS: Prioritizing state-of-the-art learning means our educational team looks for opportunities to bring cutting-edge technology to our students, like the Anatomage tables that arrived this year. Our CTE department pursued and successfully received grant funds for these medical-school-level virtual dissection tables that will let our healthcare students learn anatomy, diseases and a variety of lessons from 3D, touchscreen images of the human body.

Why a Foundation for Clovis Schools

Clovis Unified must do more with less. In the 2021-22 school year, the district's per-student funding was an average of \$2,610 lower than any other district in Fresno County. That represents \$108 million less funds that could have benefited kids in the classroom with programs, materials and curriculum.
