CSI

Clovis Support and Intervention, is a RTI tier two intervention and is based on the National Student Assistance Program (SAP) Training Institute Model. This model trains Certified Facilitators who help students positively change behavior to achieve their personal and academic goals.

The International Student Assistance Program Training Institute has made a huge impact on a world-wide basis. Their research shows ...

75% reduction in the school dropout rate
75% reduction in school fights

70% of staff members feel more effective in helping students and their own families

CSI support groups are designed to give students a place to discuss their concerns, find someone to listen to them without judgment and provide support. Students learn how to listen and communicate, see that they are not alone, gain coping skills and have additional adult support in achieving success in all areas of their life, regardless of the challenges they may face.

- Groups are Confidential
- Students meet one time a week for 8 weeks during the school day
- Students are responsible for making up missed work and assignments during missed class time for group
- Two Trained Staff members
 Facilitate each group

The Safe & Drug Free Schools Program of the Idaho Department of Education reported the following results from students who participated in support groups:

83% of the students in support groups reported that the program <u>helped them</u> <u>stay in school.</u>

73% reported that the program had a positive effect on school attendance

77% reported that they had <u>stopped or</u> <u>decreased use of tobacco, alcohol or other drugs</u>

85% reported that the program gave them positive ways to deal with problems

81% reported that they felt <u>increased</u> <u>feelings of self-worth</u>

71% reported that the program had a positive effect on overall schoolwork

77% reported that the program had an overall positive effect
