# COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS

(Test Optional for MOST CA Colleges)

## SAT

- ▶ Scholastics Aptitude Test
- ▶ Contains two sections
  - ▶ Math
  - ▶ Evidence-Based Reading & Writing
- ▶ 3-hour test
- ▶ Total score max is 1600
- ▶ Fee-based: \$55 (fee waivers available for those who qualify)
- ▶ Dates
  - ▶ March 11, 2023
  - ▶ May 6, 2023
  - ▶ June 3, 2023
- ▶ SAT is no longer offering Subject Tests or the optional essay
- ▶ Use code 3594 to send SAT scores to ALL 23 CSU campuses

## ACT

- ▶ American College Testing
- ▶ Contains four sections
  - ▶ English
  - ▶ Reading
  - ▶ Math
  - ▶ Science
  - ▶ Optional 5<sup>th</sup> section: Writing Test
- ▶ 2 hours & 55 minutes test; 3 hours & 35 minutes with writing test
- ▶ Total score scale is 1 to 36
- ▶ Fee-based: \$60 or \$85 with writing test (fee waivers available for those who qualify)
- ▶ Dates
  - ▶ February 11, 2023
  - ▶ April 15, 2023
  - ▶ June 10, 2023
  - ▶ July 15, 2023

**If you send scores to one UC campus, then ALL 10 campuses will have access.**

# QuestBridge – College Prep Scholars Program

- ▶ National program that provides an advantage in the admission process to top colleges and universities for high-achieving 11<sup>th</sup>-grade students from a low-income background.
- ▶ Many College Prep Scholars are selected as Finalists for the FULLY paid tuition QuestBridge National College Match program during their 12<sup>th</sup>-grade year.
- ▶ Juniors get a head start by being able to fill out full college applications early, in order to receive valuable support & guidance on how to make their application stand out further.
- ▶ College Prep Scholars are eligible for FULL scholarships to college summer programs and the Quest for Excellence Award (an all-expenses paid campus visit)
- ▶ The FREE application opens in early February and can be found online at [www.questbridge.org/high-school-students/college-prep-scholars](http://www.questbridge.org/high-school-students/college-prep-scholars)
- ▶ For more information about this program, the National College Match program (12<sup>th</sup> grade), and eligibility for both programs please visit the QuestBridge website.
- ▶ **Deadline to apply will be late March 2023.**

# NCAA/NAIA Athletic Eligibility

- ▶ Be sure to check with your counselor to see if you are on track and meet eligibility requirements.
- ▶ Minimum GPA of 2.3 and corresponding SAT/ACT score MIGHT be required.
- ▶ If needed send SAT/ACT scores to the NCAA (using code 9999) and to the NAIA (using code 9876)
- ▶ Register with the NCAA Eligibility Center and/or NAIA at the end of this school year.
- ▶ 16 core units are needed for eligibility and one year of a college prep class (P) is equal to one core unit.
- ▶ Classes that earn core units:
  - ▶ English (P)
  - ▶ Math (P)
  - ▶ Science (P)
  - ▶ Social Science (P)
  - ▶ World Language (P)

## Center for Advanced Research & Technology (CART)

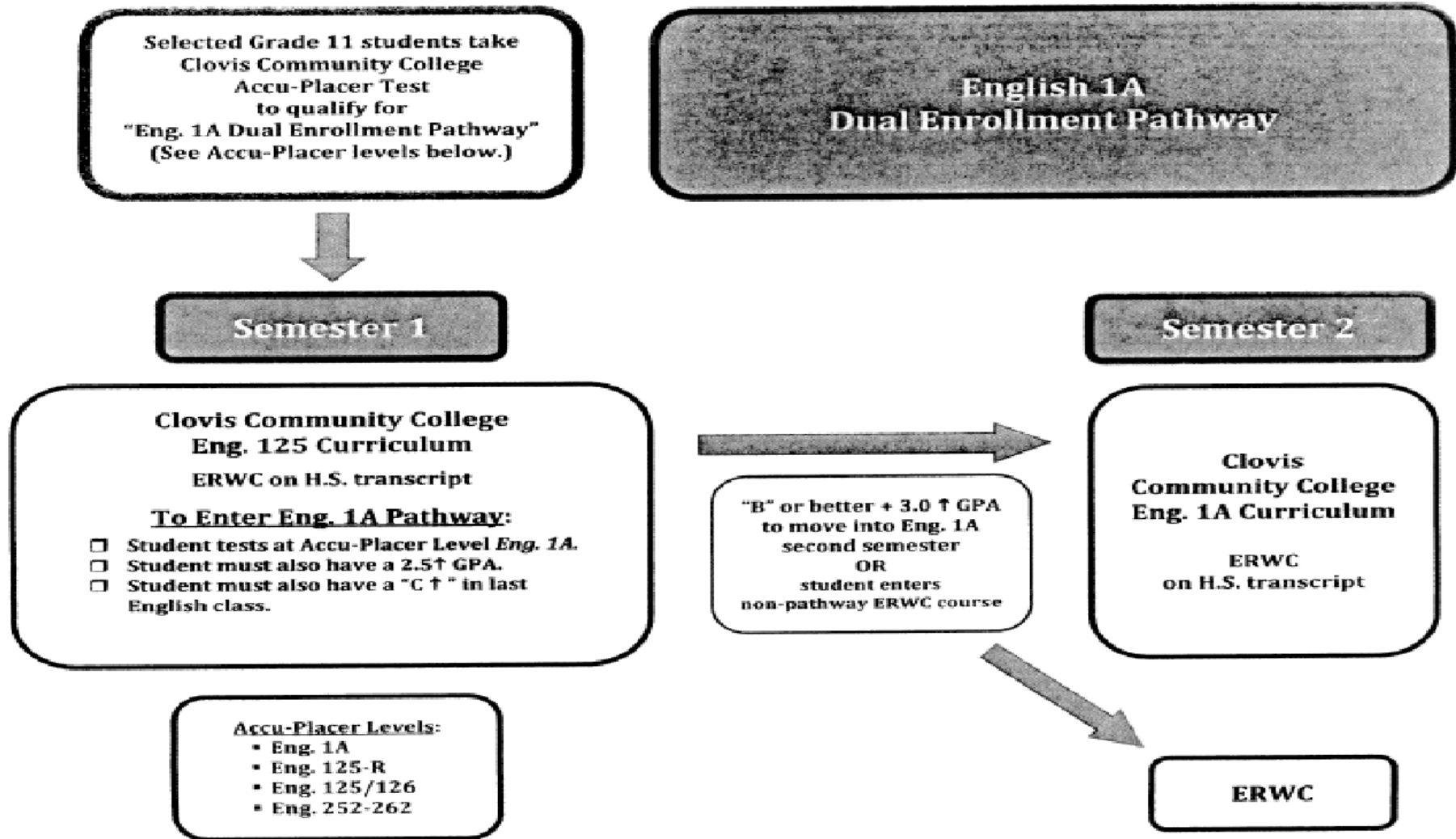
- ▶ Online application opened December 1<sup>st</sup> at <http://CART.org/>
- ▶ Application deadline = **February 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023 by 11:59 pm** to be entered into Lottery for your first-choice lab.
- ▶ CART presentation on Jan. 24<sup>th</sup>, 2023 during PE. If you missed it or don't have PE then use the links below to access more information.
- ▶ CART field trip is on Feb. 7<sup>th</sup>, 2023. **Must** be signed up to attend.
- ▶ CART Family Information Nights = January 26<sup>th</sup> and February 8<sup>th</sup> on the CART campus. Time is TBD
- ▶ CART waives the PE requirement.

## Career Technical Education & Regional Occupational Program

- ▶ CTE is a pathways program to assist with future career planning.
- ▶ ROP classes are 2 periods held every day and waive the PE requirement, but **ONLY** if there is no room for PE to fit into the schedule.
- ▶ All 5 CUSD high schools have CTE & ROP classes.

# MONEY MANAGEMENT/ ALGEBRA TOPICS

- ▶ Dual enrolled math class for seniors
  - ▶ Earn high school and college credits at the same time.
  - ▶ Not recommended for seniors who plan on applying to four-year colleges.
- ▶ Must have “C” or better in Math 2 and/or Math 3
- ▶ Must attend Community College summer class INTDS 50
  - ▶ 3 college units will be earned
  - ▶ Most colleges now require an intro college class, and this meets that requirement
  - ▶ This class is FREE
  - ▶ 4 days a week for 4 weeks total (8:30 – 12:30)

# High School Enrichment Program

- ▶ Opportunity to earn college credits while in high school.
- ▶ Must have at least a 2.5 GPA to apply.
- ▶ Must apply before each semester and summer session.
- ▶ MAX of two college classes each semester and summer.
- ▶ Tuition is FREE, but the student is responsible for purchasing textbooks and supplies needed for each class.
- ▶ College class grades and credits are NOT posted on a high school transcript. NOT dual enrollment.
- ▶ Classes are online or at the Community College campus.

# REGISTRATION

## Registration Form Distribution:

- ▶ Tuesday, February 21<sup>st</sup>
- ▶ During PE class/period

\*\*\*If you don't have a PE class then go to the Counseling Center before school, at lunch, or after school, starting Feb. 21<sup>st</sup>, to pick up your registration form.

## Registration Days:

- ▶ Wednesday, March 1<sup>st</sup> or
- ▶ Thursday, March 2<sup>nd</sup>
- ▶ During English class/period
- ▶ Sign up for senior classes and summer school if needed.

\*\*\*If you are a CART student, please contact your counselor to make an appointment to register.

# Work Permit Process

- ▶ Entire process is done online.
- ▶ Follow ALL directions carefully at: <https://rec.cusd.com/WorkPermitApplication1.aspx>
- ▶ Minimum GPA of 2.0 required and MUST be passing ALL classes with at least a letter grade of "D" or higher at each grading period (6-week, 12-week, and semester).
- ▶ Must be on track for graduation and not credit deficient.
- ▶ Must have good attendance.
- ▶ Must have good behavior.
- ▶ Once the application is filled out it MUST be emailed to Ms. Hulbert at [SandyHulbert@cusd.com](mailto:SandyHulbert@cusd.com)
- ▶ It takes 3-5 school days for Ms. Hulbert to process each application. Plan accordingly and notify your employer!

# Heads Up for Senior Year

## FAFSA & AB 469

- ▶ Free Application for Federal Student Aid and CA Assembly Bill 469
- ▶ AB 469 states that ALL high school seniors MUST complete the FAFSA.
- ▶ FAFSA is based on family income and requires tax information to be submitted.
- ▶ By submitting FAFSA during senior year students are eligible for FREE Community College Classes, Middle-Class Scholarships, Work-Study, Academic & Athletic Scholarships, and Low-Interest Student Loans.

## Letters of Recommendation

- ▶ Most of you will need two to three letters of recommendation during your senior year.
- ▶ Letters of recommendation are needed for various college, scholarship, and job applications.
- ▶ Letters are written by teachers, counselors, bosses, and anyone else who is not a family member.
- ▶ Most letters take at least 7 to 10 school days to write.
- ▶ There is a letter of recommendation request form online and in the counseling center to help you ask someone to write a letter for you.

# Join the Class of 2024 Google Classroom

## Google Classroom Join Code = 7ZRX6iW

### 1. Go to Google Classroom

- Download the Google Classroom app on your mobile device or go to the website [classroom.google.com](https://classroom.google.com) (the app is preferred so you can get push notifications).
- Make sure you are logged in under your SCHOOL account.

### 2. Join a Class

- Locate the plus icon in the upper right of the classroom page to enter the join code.
- Enter the code above – 7ZRX6iW

### 3. Turn on Notifications

- Locate your settings within the app (usually accessed by clicking the upper left button).
- Go to “Notifications” and turn on classroom notifications (email and/or classes you’re enrolled in).

### 4. Ask if you Need Help

- Come by the Activities Office or ask one of your teachers to help you with your initial set-up if you are having a hard time getting added.
