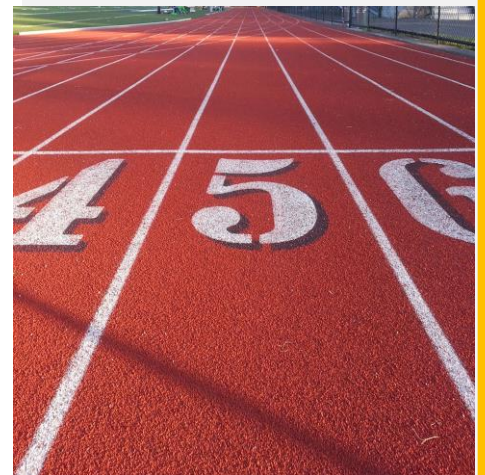

FRIENDLY REMINDERS
