Each month the district's Return to Learn Plan is updated as a result of an executive order, Illinois Department of Public Health change or our district making adjustments based on current circumstances. There are two changes this month:

- The second is an emergency plan to ensure the district is able to continue to provide face-to-face instruction if an outbreak or driver shortage would occur impacting First Student's ability to provide daily bus transportation.
