Each year, some students leave a legacy in the record books. This year, multiple Kahok winter athletes earned a place in school history for their outstanding performances.

Kahok Basketball: Senior Jamorie Wysinger reached 1,000 career points and broke the season 3-point record. Senior Nick Horras reached 1,000 career points.

Lady Kahoks Basketball: Junior Talesha Gilmore reached 1,000 career points and broke the blocks-in-a-season record. Senior Ella Guerrero broke the career and single-season 3-point records.

Girls Bowling: The team finished fourth in the IHSA State Finals. Team Members: Livia Montgomery, Caici Buckman, Kellen Stephens, Laila Jaoko, Taylor Mordis, Alayna Lange and Autumn Morley.

March 19 Ballot Initiative Know the Facts Before You Vote


Early voting for the March 19th primary election begins in communities on Monday, March 4th.

Before you cast your vote, here is a summary of facts to help you make an informed decision about the CUSD 10 zero-rate-change ballot proposal to address critical facility needs:

- The tax levy amount previously allocated to retire debt from the early 2000s would provide funding for an equal increase in the district's Operations and Maintenance (O&M) Fund rate (from 50 cents to 72 cents).
- This shift allows the district to invest more resources in critical facility needs without incurring new debt or paying interest, and <u>the</u> <u>total tax rate remains unchanged.</u>
- This method leverages existing resources efficiently to address our facility needs.

The funding path chosen by the board of education is a <u>tax transfer</u>, which involves reallocating existing funds without raising overall taxes. This shift allows the district to invest in critical facility needs - like safety and security, heating and cooling upgrades, and ADA accessibility - without changing the tax rate.
