# A Message about the **Proposed Budget**

In Copiague, we take great pride in fostering an environment where our students are provided with many opportunities to succeed now and into the future. During the past several years, thanks to strong community support, our student achievement has increased and the number of seniors graduating with Regents diplomas has risen. Our student-athletes have continued to compete on local and state levels, the fine arts department has been expanded to offer more opportunities for students K-12, and our extracurricular offerings have high student participation rates.

Over the last few months, the Board of Education has worked with administration to create a budget that continues to provide that solid educational foundation for our student population while remaining conscious of the financial burden faced by our taxpayers. With this in mind, the proposed budget maintains all current programs, services and support functions for our children, with a minimal tax levy increase of 0.53 percent. As the levy increase is within the state-mandated cap, a simple majority of voters (50 percent plus one) is required for approval.

Copiague residents are encouraged to exercise their right to vote on Tuesday, May 17. Polls will be open at Great Neck Road Elementary School from **10 a.m. to 9 p.m.** Please note the earlier end time of the voting hours.





# **VOTER REQUIREMENTS**

- You are a U.S. Citizen.
- You are 18 years of age or older.
- You have been a resident of the school district for at least 30 days prior to the vote.
- You are registered to vote in the general elections or are registered to vote in the school elections.

#### ABSENTEE BALLOTS

The District Clerk must receive applications at least seven (7) days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter. All completed ballots must be in the hands of the District Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on the day of the election. For further information, call 631-842-4015.

#### Q: What does this budget support?

A: The proposed 2016-17 school budget supports all current academic and co-curricular programs and the goals that the Board of Education and administration have established for the District. It also includes cost-saving measures in order to reduce the financial impact on taxpayers. It is important to note that this budget is within the District's allowable tax levy limit.

Q: What happens if voters reject the proposed budget? A: If voters reject the proposed budget, the school board may put up the same or a revised budget for a second vote or adopt a contingency budget. If the proposed budget is defeated twice by voters, the District must adopt a contingent budget. Under the new law, a District that adopts a contingent budget may not increase its current tax levy by any amount – which would impose, in effect, a zero percent cap.

#### Q: Does the tax levy indicate how much my taxes will rise? A: No. The tax levy is the amount of money the school district can raise through property taxes. The amount an individual will pay to contribute to the levied amount is the tax rate as determined by the homeowner's assessed value for their property.

#### Q: Where can I get more information?
