1. Motion by Mrs. Fischer, seconded by Mr. Newman to approve the following resolution from Eastern Suffolk BOCES concerning the Joint Municipal Cooperative Bidding Program:

RESOLUTION (A)

JOINT MUNICIPAL COOPERATIVE BIDDING PROGRAM

WHEREAS, various educational and municipal corporations located within the State of New York desire to bid jointly for generally needed services and standardized supply and equipment items; and

WHEREAS, the <u>Copiague Public Schools</u>, an educational/municipal corporation (hereinafter the "Participant") is desirous of selectively participating with other educational and/or municipal corporations in the State of New York in joint bidding in the areas mentioned above pursuant to General Municipal Law § 119-0 and Education Law Section 1950; and

WHEREAS, the Participant is a municipality within the meaning of General Municipal Law § 119-n and is eligible to participate in the Board of Cooperative Educational Services, First Supervisory District of Suffolk County (hereinafter Eastern Suffolk BOCES) Joint Municipal Cooperative Bidding Program (hereinafter the "Program") in the areas mentioned above; and

WHEREAS, the Participant acknowledges receipt of the Program description inclusive of Eastern Suffolk BOCES' standard bid packet and the general conditions relating to said Program; and

WHEREAS, with respect to all activities conducted by the Program, the Participant wishes to delegate to Eastern Suffolk BOCES the responsibility for drafting of bid specifications, advertising for bids, accepting and opening bids, tabulating bids, awarding the bids, and reporting the results to the Participant.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Participant hereby appoints Eastern Suffolk BOCES to represent it and to act as the lead agent in all matters related to the Program as described above; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Participant hereby authorizes Eastern Suffolk BOCES to place all legal advertisements for any required cooperative bidding in Newsday, which is designated as the official newspaper for the Program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a Participant Meeting shall be held annually consisting of a representative from each Program Participant. Notice of the meeting shall be given to each representative at least five (5) days prior to such meeting; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an Advisory Committee will be formed consisting of five to ten representatives of Program Participants for a term of three (3) years as authorized by General Municipal Law §119-o.2.j.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Agreement with the Participant shall be for a term of one (1) year as authorized by General Municipal Law §119-o.2.j.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Participant agrees to pay Eastern Suffolk BOCES an annual fee as determined annually by Eastern Suffolk BOCES to act as the lead agent for the Program.

Mr. Leunig announced that three of our sports teams have won the Winter Sportsmanship Award. Also, two Copiague students from Wilson Tech captured top honors at a recent SkillsUSA competition held at Farmingdale State University. In a recent Newsday article Copiague was one of eleven Long Island schools recognized nationally for increasing access to Advanced Placement courses and maintaining or improving the rate of which students score well on demanding AP tests. Finally, Mr. Leunig mentioned a complimentary letter that was recently in the Amityville Record.

7. As part of the Second Budget Work Session, Mr. Leunig began by reviewing the First Budget Work Session and the budget hole that was defined (\$7.6 million). Mr. Michaelsen continued by reviewing the budget building process and how certain cuts were derived to help close the hole. Mr. Andrews reviewed the proposed staffing reductions and shared how this was the most difficult piece because it involves people losing jobs. Finally, Mr. Leunig went through all the other pieces including dipping into reserves to help close the budget hole. As it stands now the remaining hole is down to just under \$1.9 million. Mr. Leunig explained that if the budget process stopped at this point, the result would be a 3.66% tax rate increase, or we can work on getting the tax rate lower while waiting for the state budget picture to be resolved.
