JOINT MUNICIPAL COOPERATIVE BIDDING PROGRAM RESOLUTION (A)

WHEREAS, various educational and municipal corporations located within the State of New York desire to bid jointly for generally needed services and standardized supply and equipment items; and

WHEREAS, the Copiague Union Free School District, an educational/municipal corporation (hereinafter the "Participant") is desirous of selectively participating with other educational and/or municipal corporations in the State of New York in joint bidding in the areas mentioned above pursuant to General Municipal Law § 119-o and Education Law Section 1950; and

WHEREAS, the Participant is a municipality within the meaning of General Municipal Law § 119-n and is eligible to participate in the Board of Cooperative Educational Services, First Supervisory District of Suffolk County (hereinafter Eastern Suffolk BOCES) Joint Municipal Cooperative Bidding Program (hereinafter the "Program") in the areas mentioned above; and

WHEREAS, the Participant acknowledges receipt of the Program description inclusive of Eastern Suffolk BOCES' standard bid packet and the general conditions relating to said Program; and

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WHEREAS, with respect to all activities conducted by the Program, the Participant wishes to delegate to Eastern Suffolk BOCES the responsibility for drafting of bid specifications, advertising for bids, accepting and opening bids, tabulating bids, awarding the bids, and reporting the results to the Participant.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Participant hereby appoints Eastern Suffolk BOCES to represent it and to act as the lead agent in all matters related to the Program as described above; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Participant hereby authorizes Eastern Suffolk BOCES to place all legal advertisements for any required cooperative bidding in Newsday, which is designated as the official newspaper for the Program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a Participant Meeting shall be held annually consisting of a representative from each Program Participant. Notice of the meeting shall be given to each representative at least five (5) days prior to such meeting; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an Advisory Committee will be formed consisting of five to ten representatives of Program Participants for a term of three (3) years as authorized by General Municipal Law §119-o.2.j.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Agreement with the Participant shall be for a term of one (1) year as authorized by General Municipal Law §119-o.2.j.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Participant agrees to pay Eastern Suffolk BOCES an annual fee as determined annually by Eastern Suffolk BOCES to act as the lead agent for the Program.

Mr. Leunig reported on the Legislative Breakfast which took place on Saturday, March 17. It began with a performance by the Madrigal Choir, under the direction of Ms. Occhiogrosso. Next there were presentations given by the AP College Board, Pastor Kirton and MANA, and by Senator Fuschillo and Senator Johnson in recognition of the district receiving the National AP Award. Mrs. Gavey and Mr. Sales gave a great presentation entitled, "Advocating for Copiague and Long Island."

Mr. Leunig announced that the DECA club came home with 8 top ten gold medals and 2 second place trophies from the State DECA Competition in Rochester. Seventeen of our high school students, along with SOUL club advisor Jaime Suarez, were selected to participate in the Dowling College Long Island Youth Summit. They presented their project entitled, "No Friend Left Behind," which outlined the SOUL program. The group won *Most Innovative Project Idea*. They were awarded with a school certificate and each student received a \$500 scholarship for Dowling College.

7. School Budget 2012/13 – Work Session

The budget work session included a brief update on the expenditure side of the budget, where Mr. Michaelsen showed a reduction in the deficit of around \$499,000 bringing it under \$1 million. The second part of the presentation focused on the revenue forecast update.
