Mr. Leunig reported on the Superintendent's Fall Conference he attended in Saratoga Springs. The Commissioner of Education was there and reported that the education reform agenda is moving forward. Mr. Leunig explained that for now we are in "safe harbor" status because our teacher contract is not up for renewal for another four years. However, many districts are dealing with the APPR reform right now. The Commissioner was asked if he could give school districts an additional year to phase in the new reforms. The Commissioner was not interested, despite the fact that the current path to reform is very murky. Mr. Leunig also opined that the state aid that was promised by the Governor last year for the next year will likely not materialize to the degree we had hoped. Based upon his statements, the Commissioner's solution appears to be redistributing state aid from wealthier districts to poorer districts.

On Friday evening, Mr. Leunig attended the Kiwanis Club of Copiague's 25th Anniversary Dinner. At the dinner, Board President, Mike Greb, was inducted as Treasurer to the Kiwanis Club. This year the Kiwanis Club's goal is to raise more money for scholarships.

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Saturday, Mr. Leunig participated in the Homecoming Parade and festivities. That evening was the 15th Annual Hall of Achievement Induction in which five well deserving individuals were inducted.
