2. Superintendent's Report:

Mr. Leunig began his Superintendent's report by highlighting some great things going on in the district. The High School has received a Support Music Merit Award from the NAMM Foundations "Best Communities for Music Education" award. Rachael Korba, an 8th grade student in the Middle School was the winner the "Legislator for a Day" essay contest sponsored by the Suffolk County government offices. She will get to spend the day in the Suffolk County government offices as an honorary legislator for a day with Suffolk County Legislative Presiding Officer DuWayne Gregory. Finally, Mr. Leunig shared some of the colleges/universities the Top 10 students have been accepted to - Harvard, Cornell, Vanderbilt, Northeastern, US Naval Academy, Boston College, Stanford, Duke, Yale, John Hopkins, Hunter, Brown, FIT, Syracuse, University of Iowa and RIT.

3. School Budget 2014/15 – Work Session:

Mr. Leunig began the budget work session by reminding everyone that at the last meeting the state still had not completed their budget process and our budget gap was at \$4 million. On March 31, the state approved a budget and while we did get an increase in state aid, it is not enough to close the gap as we are still behind where we should be on state aid. At this point the gap is down to \$1.7 million. At tonight's meeting additional reductions will further reduce the budget gap to approximately \$600,000. Most of these reductions come through a combination of attrition at the elementary level and not filling current vacancies for other positions.

April 24th is the last day to adopt the budget. In order to bring a balanced budget to this meeting it is likely that there will have to be some staffing reductions for next year.
