BOND RESOLUTION OF THE COPIAGUE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, NEW YORK, ADOPTED JANUARY 11, 2016, AUTHORIZING

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THE CONSTRUCTION OF ALTERATIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO ALL DISTRICT SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND/OR SITES; STATING THE ESTIMATED TOTAL COST THEREOF IS \$42,963,526; APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR; AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$42,963,526 SERIAL BONDS OF SAID DISTRICT TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION.

Recital

WHEREAS, at the Special District Meeting duly called and held on November 23, 2015, in the Copiague Union Free School District, in the County of Suffolk, New York (the "District"), a majority of the qualified voters present and voting approved a Bond Proposition authorizing the construction of alterations and improvements to all District school buildings and/or sites, at the estimated maximum cost of \$42,963,526; and such qualified voters then present and voting further authorized the Board of Education to levy and collect a tax to be collected in annual installments to pay the principal of and interest on the \$42,963,526 serial bonds authorized to be issued;

Now, therefore,

THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE COPIAGUE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Board of Education) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Copiague Union Free School District, in the County of Suffolk, New York, is hereby authorized to construct alterations and improvements to all District school buildings and/or sites, substantially as described in a Plan prepared for the District with the assistance of Wendel Architects, including: interior reconstruction, space reconfiguration and building additions to provide for new and/or enhanced classroom, music, science, and other space; improvements to the electrical, lighting, heating, ventilation, air conditioning, fire safety, plumbing and public address systems; the replacement of windows, doors, floors and ceilings; site, parking, sidewalk, building envelope and masonry improvements; athletic and recreation improvements including track and field reconstruction and/or replacements; and the installation of high-technology security and other features in all District school buildings, including the installation of new communications and cabling systems, and security cameras; and the installation of new ADA compliant door hardware; all of the foregoing to include all furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, and ancillary and related site, demolition and other work required in connection therewith. The estimated total cost thereof, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, is \$42,963,526 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of finance includes the issuance of \$42,963,526 serial bonds of the District to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the District to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Serial bonds of the District in the amount of \$42,963,526 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law") to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

- (a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the purpose for which serial bonds are authorized to be issued pursuant to this resolution, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 97 of the Law, is thirty (30) years.
- (b) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the District for expenditures made for the purpose or purposes for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 4. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the District, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the District without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the District are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the District by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and

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any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 60.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Board of Education relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of all bonds herein and heretofore authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, are hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer of the District.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the District is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution, or a summary hereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
 - (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 7. This bond resolution shall take effect immediately, and the District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish the foregoing resolution, in summary, together with a Notice attached in substantially the form prescribed by §81.00 of the Law in "The Amityville Record" and "The Beacon," two newspapers having a general circulation within the District and hereby designated the official newspapers of said District for such publication.
