Dr. Bannon reported that the Community Summit was a huge success. There were around 300 people in attendance and the presentations by the students were outstanding.

Next, Dr. Bannon announced that the following four teams have won the Sportsmanship Award: Middle School Girls Volleyball, Junior Varsity Boys Basketball, Middle School Boys Basketball and Varsity Boys Basketball.

Dr. Bannon and the Board discussed a survey they received from the New York State Education Department. Maureen Donohue-Whitley, District Superintendent of the Second Supervisory District of Suffolk County and BOCES, has announced her retirement. As a result of the upcoming vacancy, the Department is required to commence the statutory process outlined in Article 45 of Education Law. Part of the process is commencing a survey of the Western Suffolk BOCES component school districts as well as districts contiguous to Western Suffolk BOCES. The Board decided on Option 1 – Make no change in the Second Supervisory District of Suffolk County and BOCES.

Finally, Dr. Bannon gave out the NYSSBA Board Achievement Award to Mr. Robinson and the NYSSBA Board Life Achievement Award to Mr. Sales. To be recognized for the Board Achievement Award, an individual must earn at least 75 points and to be recognized for the Board Lifetime Achievement Award, an individual must earn at least 500 points. Members qualify for recognition points by participating in NYSSBA developmental activities, such as the New Member Academy, Board Officers Academy, NYSSBA Annual Convention, legal conferences, regional workshops or district level custom improvement programs.
